On Saturday November 14 the KBS packed the house at the Vernon Club with over 300 in attendance to see Jon Boy Slim, Josh Garrett and the Bottomline and Jimmy Hall. Jon Boy Slim started the evening with a solo set to help warm up the crowd. The club was already pretty full when Josh Garrett launched into this show. Launched is the operative word here because that's when the party took off. Garrett is a full octane performer who had the crowd on their feet with his mix of Louisiana blues, funk and zydeco. He played a full one hour and forty-five minute set and took a break just long enough to catch his breath and come out to back the headliner for the night Jimmy Hall. KBS board member Keith Clements tipped me off to a surprise a few days before the show. An old friend of Jimmy's was going to stop by that night and bring his guitar. True to his word he showed up just before Josh and Jimmy took the stage. It was none other than Kentucky native Greg Martin who used to play with Jimmy Hall in the band "The Mighty Jeremiahs." The rest of the night is a blur for me. At one point I remember Jimmy Hall dancing from one end of the stage to the other with his saxophone in hand and the small dance floor at the Vernon was filled with female admirers. I think Jimmy could have danced out the back door ala the Pied Piper and they would have followed him. The band played until after midnight and no one wanted to leave. I can't remember a better KBS birthday party. I hope everyone had as good a time as I did.

That evening could not have taken place without the help of a lot of people. First I want to thank KBS board members Keith Clements, Bob Brown and Les Reynolds, the members of this years' anniversary party committee. Les was the chairman of the committee. Thanks also to the volunteers who worked that night including Carolyn Joyce, Chris Grube, Cole Kiser, David Modica, Margot Maxwell, Mark Barnes, Mark Sneed, Nelson Grube, Pam Dean and Sandy French. Natalie Carter did another stellar job with the presentation detailing the history of the blues society. Jeanne Doak fixed a huge cake in the shape of a guitar that was gone before the night was over. Jim Masterson came before the party and hung several of his large blues portraits around the club. It made me feel like I was back in the Cherokee Blues Pub where some of his paintings used to be on display. Terri Williams and her staff at FireFresh BBQ did a great job providing pork and chicken dinners to the crowd and the musicians. The Downtown Recording Studio staff made everyone sound great and once again Vernon Club owner Dale McCall, manager Eric Widmayer and the entire staff of the Vernon made us feel right at home.

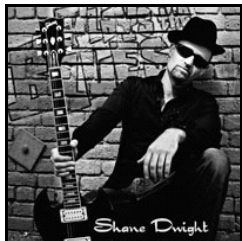

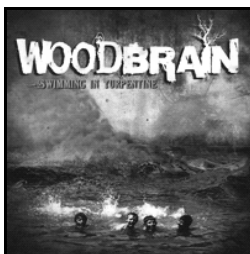
**Shane Dwight  
Plays the Blues  
R-Tist Records/Vizztone**

Sometimes you find an artist that can excel at a show but fail to translate to a CD, or vice versa. Well, with that being said, Shane Dwight's latest effort is all vice without the versa. Simply titled "Shane Dwight Plays the Blues", it's neither misleading or contradictory. All ten tracks will satisfy all blues lovers. I found myself totally dependent on tracks 1 ("Bad News Morning"), 9 ("Have Some of That"), and 5 ("Ode to Albert"), but the entire CD got the repeat treatment.

Having seen Shane Dwight perform live in Monterey, CA at a blues club, Sly McFly's, I've seen firsthand his capable lead and singing abilities, but what also sticks out in my mind is his habit of twirling his **head** around and round, all the while keeping a constant rhythm.

I can totally imagine someone who purchases this CD going to catch his show and being impressed how he is able to capture the live version recording so well. All the songs were written and arranged by Mr. Dwight, as were most of his previous works, thus proving that he not only plays the blues, suffice to say he lives the blues.

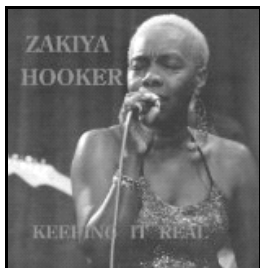
**Woodbrain  
Swimming in Turpentine  
Yellow Dog Records**

There is a new group of rock musicians out there who have been inspired by the great masters of blues of the likes of Robert Johnson and others, yet still like their rock roots. Some carry their music one step further into another yet unnamed genre that "skirts" the others. Woodbrain is a good example of that type of music. They are not classify-able into one or the other category.

This group, from Portland Oregon, consists of Joe McMurrian (vocals/guitar), David Lipkind (harmonica), Jason Honl (bass) and Jimi Bott (drums) and recorded 13 original songs on this CD. Jimi Bott is an accomplished musician who played for the Fabulous Thunderbirds, Rod Piazza & the Mighty Flyers and Mark Hummel. This music is not blues, rock, roots or anything else, but a combination of all of the above. This music is for the rock fan looking for blues influenced songs, not for the blues fan. On some songs, the only relation to the blues is the harmonica.

All in all, the CD is not bad, but took me listening to it several times before I caught on. Two songs are reminiscent of the halcyon days of the 70's music that was not understandable without some chemical additive. Take it or leave it.

**Zakiya Hooker  
Keeping It Real  
Boogie with the Hook Records**

John Lee Hooker's living legacy is his daughter, Zakiya, whose fourth CD carries the torch of traditional blues (and some not-so-traditional) with 13 tunes that cover three of her father's recordings, one by Robert Johnson and includes several originals she and husband/producer/bassist Ollan Bell created.

All-in-all, this is a good effort. However, Zakiya doesn't seem to quite live up to the hype and "greatness-by-default" that seems bestowed upon her. Of course, with ancestry such as hers, expectations would naturally run a tad high--and perhaps unfairly so. With the knowledge of John Lee's gravelly, deep baritone, one might expect at least a hint of a snarl or growl from the woman. Maybe a bit more grit, dirt and deep soul. The instruments are actually a bit more soulful than Zakiya's vocals. Still, she's got a nice enough voice and carries each tune off with poise and skill.

Some of the more notable tunes include Johnson's "Standing at the Crossroads" (a tune that's gone by several titles with the word "Crossroads" in them), which is a more rockin' version than the original with some excellent blues harp being played by someone not mentioned in the liner notes. Track six ("End of the World Blues") is actually introduced by John Lee Himself with a spoken word segue into Zakiya's soft bluesy-jazzy groove. "Love Foreclosure" (Bell/Hooker) is a sweetly sensual tune where she drops her voice down a notch and it sounds nice. Perhaps the best-known tune is "One Bourbon, One Scotch, One Beer," a rollicking number featuring great piano from any number of listed keyboard players (Janice Maxie, Sugar G, or two Argentines Silvio Marzolini or Nicolas Raffetta, as much of this recording was produced in Argentina). Finally, she joins her late dad for a duet on the last track titled "Rock these Blues Away" with a confident vocal performance that's likely the best of the entire CD. Even the backup singers do a superb job.

The Blues Society almost never gets Holiday Music for review. Only thing I have is a couple of *Gene Autry Sings Rudolf* and *The Three Stooges Meet Frosty the Snowman* 33's except -come to think of it - if Ray Stevens did a Christmas song, I've probably got it on 45 rpm.

So – from the Blues Society's 21<sup>st</sup> Birthday party I have a double CD – *Soul Fixin, Live From Texas – 5 Hours of Music, 5 Bands, with 1 Mission*: a festival of like-minded individuals who appreciate all the heart and soul musicians share with us through their music and performance. [www.soul-fixin'music](http://www.soul-fixin'music). And it is dedicated to the memory of Luther Allison 1939 – 1997.

Featured on this 5 hour mass recording of *like minded* roots music are: The Shane Henry Band, Albert Cummins, The Renee Austin Band, Randy McDonald, Junior Watson, and the Tommy Castro Band fill in the first disc, and the second disc opens with: The Tommy Castro Band with Jimmy Hall and has The Tommy Castro Band with Junior Watson, Jimmy Hall and Albert Cummins finishing the side. I would not want to have this in the dashboard CD player while driving a slow road like 64 either direction if it was being patrolled at all.

All of the officers of the Kentuckiana Blues Society – and all those who serve on the Board of Directors – do so out of their love for the blues. Whichever form, from which ever room of the big house where the blues reside that turns one on and the doesn't do a thing for the other – we still pull to keep it all alive. There is no such thing as a salary – although we all make eight figures for our work. El Presidente may make nine figures – but it's for bragging rights only as they are all zeroes. The only perk around is you get to keep the CD that you review. Unless somebody else needs it. El Presidente works very hard for sure – so buy him a beer if you see him out and around. BUT – there is one person who does more work every month the rest of us put together – and that lady is our Editor – the one who makes us write stuff and have it in to her by the 15<sup>th</sup> of each month – who reads this stuff, (edits), puts the newsletter together, gets it to the printer to be printed, folded, stamped and mailed, and puts up with more crap from us writers/reporters/picture takers/reviewers (everyone of us amateurs at everything except resorting to teen age like excuses in time of maybe crisis) – so it can get to you before the first week of each month is over - and her name is Natalie. 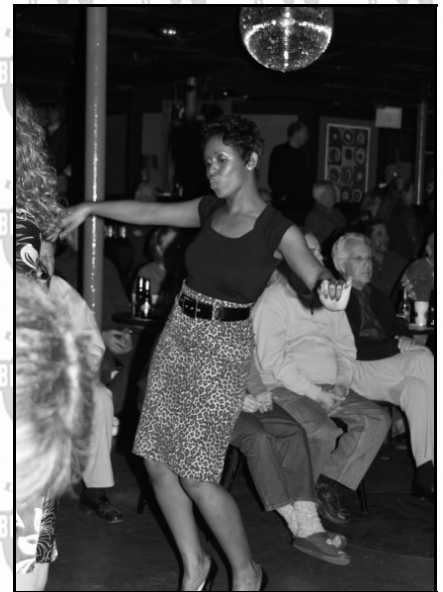

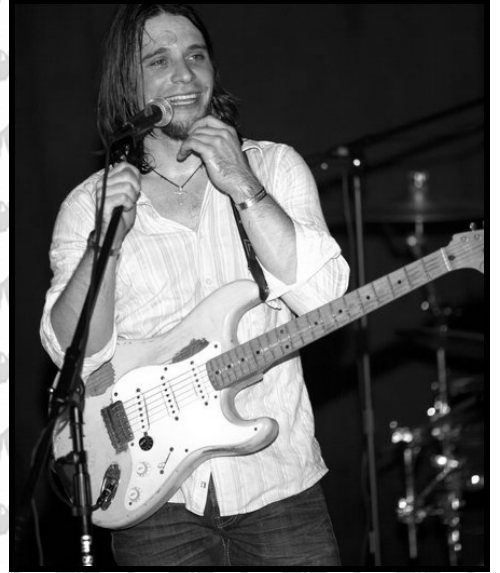
