

On Friday, July 2 local band D Man and the Alley Hounds will start things off with a show at 7:00 pm. One Shot Johnny from Magnolia, KY will then take the stage at 8:00 pm and play for two hours. The Clay Street Blues All Stars will complete the night with a show going until the early morning hours. All KBS members have to do is show their current, valid membership card at the door and they will be admitted for free. Our thanks to Kim Donze and the staff at Jim Porter's for helping us get the red, white and blues.

One of the longest running blues festivals in our area is the Louisville Blues-n-Barbecue Festival held at the Water Tower on the banks of the Ohio river. The 13th festival will take place on Friday and Saturday, July 9 and 10. In the recent past this was a three day festival but Sunday never drew that many people probably because of all the fun we had the first two days. Friday night's

headliner is Louisville blues performer and winner of the 2008 KBS Sylvester Weaver award Mr. Joe DeBow. The Saturday night headliner from Cincinnati, OH is the Sonny Moorman Group. Sonny and his band were finalists in this year's International Blues Challenge (IBC) in Memphis and he placed second in the solo/duo category at the IBC in 2007. Check this issue of *Blues News* for the full schedule. Most KBS members will have received their free tickets to the festival by the time you receive this newsletter. Just one of the many advantages to becoming a member of the Kentuckiana Blues Society.










New Music Reviews!





Andy Cohen Built Right on the Ground Earwig Records CD4959

Mr. Cohen is an accomplished guitarist and pianist. The songs on this CD are proof of that. All of the music is solo Cohen except two songs, "My Old Pal" in which he is accompanied on vocals by Kurt Anderson, and "Tennessee Blues" on which his wife joins in on vocals. On most songs he plays acoustic guitar and sings. On two songs, he plays excellent boogie woogie piano. But what makes this CD stand out is that most of the songs are pre-World War II (except the one original-"Jim Dickinson Stomp", and a 50's song by Bobby Charles). These songs are written by the likes

of Teddy Darby, Sam McGhee, Henry Spaulding, Meade Lux Lewis, Memphis Minnie, Jimmy Rogers and others.

You may not recognize any of these songs (I did not), as they are mostly obscure songs that Cohen is familiar with as he is an aficionado on this era of music. His renditions of the songs definitely sound like pre World War II music so he accomplishes his mission here-to faithfully represent the artists of that era.

Some songs are more folk music than blues or pre war blues. The vocals by Cohen are for the most part OK. A couple of songs however would be better without his vocals.

As good as his guitar playing is, my favorite song on the CD is "Shake-a-you-Boogie", a great piano song. The other songs are slower and not as moving.

These songs are not for everybody. You have to appreciate music of the era, and unaccompanied music (for the most part). Overall, the CD is OK. I would recommend finding a sound clip (www.andycohenmusic.net) first and see for yourself if it is for you.

Dave Weld and the Imperial Flames Burnin' Love Delmark Records

Dave Weld, a longtime favorite of the Chicago blues scene has joined the Delmark label with this CD. Weld was tutored in the blues by J.B. Hutto and Hound Dog Taylor and was a founding member of Lil' Ed and the Blues Imperials. He and Lil' Ed are still good friends and in fact, Lil' Ed contributes one of the songs and guitar on other tracks on this CD.

There are 13 tracks on the CD, seven of which are originals by Weld. The others were written by the band members except for "Ed's Boogie" which was written by Lil' Ed, and "Things are So Slow" by J.B Hutto. Weld plays guitar and sings, Abb Locke plays tenor Saxophone, Harry Yaseen plays piano, Jeff Taylor plays drums and sings, Bernard Reed, Herman Applewhite, and Dave Kaye play bass, Monica Garcia sings and Lil' Ed plays rhythm guitar and sings.

Even with the tutelage by Hound Dog and J.B, Weld's music is distinctive if for no other reason than it is infused with saxophone. It does not have the slide licks throughout that are the trademark of his slide pro friends, however there is definitely some slide here, in particular on "Sweet Shiny Brown Eyes" that sounds like Lil' Ed . The songs are generally not as fast moving as his mentors. Slower is good in blues though, and Weld uses (lack of) speed to his advantage. Of course there is the song by Lil' Ed that is definitely up tempo in the Lil' Ed style.

The saxophone on the music really adds a dimension to the music. "Ramblin" has a sax solo that is a great addition to the song, although the lyrics are so-so.

One of my favorite labels is Delmark because they record some really good artists. These artists may not be extremely popular a la Buddy Guy or B.B. King, but are nevertheless carrying on the blues tradition in a meaningful way. The lesser known artists are usually the ones that put more heart and soul into their music and struggle to make money while being true to the music. I have found some of the best music by unknown artists on labels like Delmark. That is why Weld fits well into the Delmark stable. Those of us who like to explore music by unknown artists owe Delmark a note of thanks, and Weld a listen. Good CD, www.daveweld.com

Foghat Last Train Home Foghat Records

Let's get one thing straight from the beginning: This is a classic rock group playing rock music--with a HEAVY blues influence. Oh yeah, and one more thing: This is a classic rock group going back to their blues roots and playing several excellent blues songs with a heavy rock influence.

Foghat. One of this reviewer's favorite rock bands--during college. Haven't listened to them since. Until now. A blues CD? Uhhhhh.... Well, it's worth a listen...

Make no mistake. Again, this is a rock band. Not all of these guys are original band members, as not all the blues songs are original numbers. However, this is a quality recording, both in content and execution.


Press release material states that this CD is the culmination of a dream shared by original co-founding member Roger Earl (drums and backing vocals) and the late "Lonesome" Dave Peverett (another original co-founder). The band always had its roots in vintage blues and Foghat's latest release brings them full circle.

Musically, you get what you'd expect from this group: Loud, well played, heavy music with an emphasis on buzzy, crunchy guitar, rock vocals and a solid beat. Bryan Bassett (who joined in 1999) adds an excellent slide guitar to the mix. Colin Earl plays some fast and mean keyboards on a couple of numbers and Lefty "Sugar Lips" Lefkowitz blends in some well-played blues harp time and again. Special guest Eddie "Bluesman" Kirkland lends vocals and guitar on the final two tracks. There are three original blues tunes: "Born for the Road", which opens the CD and sets the tone; the title track and the exciting "495 Boogie").

While most bands love to pride themselves on originality, this CD truly shines on two more well-known and "traditional" blues numbers: the slow (yet heavy) "It Hurts Me Too" and the boogie-paced "Shake Your Moneymaker"...which just goes to show, that a classic rock group can really get down and play the blues when it wants to.

This latest release from Gates includes 12 originals of mostly Texas type blues shuffles with a little funk. He plays guitar, sings, plays programmed percussion, bass and keys. He does have other musicians assist on some songs, but not on all. He also (and this helps since he plays so many instruments on the CD) records his own music and is adept at recording having an electronics background.

The songs include some pretty good lyrics-each one tells a story. "Get Around to Me" is a song that ponders the questions of when his girlfriend will have time to get around to him. "Sexy Little Cool" features Gates on slide guitar and is a shuffle about a girl with an irresistible vibe. In the song "My Babe" Gates puts down a great groove with leading bass and great guitar solos- not flashy lightning fast, but interesting skillful solos. Make no mistake about it though, he can play guitar.

The title track tells the story of Gates (except for the reference to drugs of course) addiction to blues-his unending desire to play the blues. On a few of the songs, Gates plays slow slide guitar. It almost doesn't sound like slide, more like a programmed sound.

The PR notes that Gates obviously wrote, tells of some technical aspects of the recording (such as switching pickup positions mistakenly during the recording of "Road Shufflin", but liking it so much he left it in) shows his penchant for recording perfection, but demonstrates that his feel for the music takes precedence.

The final song on the CD, "Wisdom" starts out in an unusual way. It is the only song that has backing vocals and tells of people who have passed on, that affected his life. It made me think of the ones that affected mine.

Gates has recorded a great CD in "Addicted to the Blues". It is not flashy, fiery guitar, but some well grounded blues with good lyrics and slick guitar work.

Grady Champion...where to begin? I was introduced to Grady's explosive style last June during an open house at the Blues Heaven Foundation in Chicago after Saturday's Blues Fest. The inaugural Blues Heaven wang dang doodle was pitched to celebrate completion of the first round of renovations at the historic Chess Records studio, where Willie Dixon's family continues his Foundation's work on behalf of blues musicians past, present and future. Word of the event was circulated via email beginning just a short few days before Blues Fest, and Willie's wife Marie and other

members of the family and inner circle worked a booth at the festival to get the word out about the Foundation and about the upcoming open house/fund raiser. We were told when we arrived that a local band who had been scheduled to entertain unkindly pulled out at the last minute, and that a most gracious visiting Mississippi bluesman had offered to step in.

As Grady took the stage, he told the capacity crowd in this small and pleasantly intimate setting that he was honored to be allowed to perform and he proved it in every way imaginable. He was a perfect gentleman; very respectful toward the history of the venue and the other performers in the house, and of Willie Dixon's wife and family. Most notably though, he proved it by absolutely blowing the place apart. It was a performance nobody who was there will likely ever forget.

When this CD came up for review I jumped on it even though it was the same one I had already purchased that night at Blues Heaven. I had been meaning to write something about that experience all this time, so this was my motivation to finally get it done. I honestly can't say how much seeing his live shows has informed my opinion, (he was back at Blues Fest again this year), but I do believe this live album does him justice. He masterfully presents a few standards to get the crowd warmed up, doing I'm Ready and a medley of Baby What You Want Me To Do and Bright Lights, Big City that does Willie, Muddy and Jimmy proud. A selection of solid originals follows, with You've Got Some Explaining To Do being my personal favorite of these. The classic Spoonful demonstrates enough originality to be fresh while still being faithful to the classic version, which is just the way I like it for singing-horribly-in-the-car purposes. Lonesome Bedroom Blues, credited to Delmark's Curtis Jones, is a nice slow tune, followed by Love and Memories...a tribute to moms, (Grady's in particular), that really puts the blue in blues. (Y'all call your mamas!) BB King's classic Why I Sing The Blues is the last cover on the disc; the rest are Champion originals. The Grady Champion Revue took first place at the IBC in Memphis in February, and the website, www.gradychampion.com, says that Grady is working on his movie debut in the upcoming "Rites of Spring". There are also plenty of YouTube videos...check him out!

Jackson, a native of Austin Texas, started out this CD with the song "I Just Want to Make Love to You" and leaves one with the impression that, although a different slant on the Willie Dixon tune, this is going to be a ho-hum CD. Not so, as the first is probably the weakest song on the CD. Although that first song is not bad, it left me ambivalent. The second song, gets into something a little bit more original but again, on a variation on an age old theme-"Big Legs Don't Mean Fat".

The third song, "Voodo Spell" is a blues rock song that is OK. Original but not remarkable. "Stop Breakin' Down" is a cover that I thought was Eric Clapton when I first heard it (If you've heard one, you've heard the other).

Finally, the fifth song, "Like Magic" gets into some dirty blues with great harp playing by Michael Fell. The guitar shines on this mid-tempo tune also. This is a great song and sets the tone for the rest of the CD. My favorite song on the CD is "Shoulda' Never Left Texas". This slow bluesy guitar song is 9:16 long and never gets boring.

"Chicken Legged Woman" is an acoustic song with two dobro guitars and no other instruments. It is a fine song that you can't help but like. Jackson's musical ability is unquestionable. This and the following songs prove his talent. McKinley Morganfield's "Long Distance Call" is another stand out blues song. The last song is a dancing tune with slide guitar, called "L.A. to Austin" with a driving bass and great slide.

This night was Jeff "Stick" Davis on bass - Danny Erkmon on drums and Steve Bynum - fresh out of Nashville - on guitar. My ear noticed that Steve was not just playing the regular runs in the regular ways - and that his slide guitar playing was just a bit better than his gooder than good finger playing so I hung around to yak and found out that: he is really a steel guitar player with 20 years experience playing with many big names that had him on the stage of the Opry many a night. A most interesting player to watch. Came out to show off his six string prowess just cause Larry asked him.

The show ended with no more complaints of loudness. Some of us helped Ms. Bob pick up what aluminum was laying around – she cashes it in for art supplies at the school she works at.

I haven't heard how much money we brought in for the special children of Pitt Academy – but we hope it was enough to help. I hadda stop and buy some TUMS on the way home.
