On Saturday, November 13 the Kentuckiana Blues Society (KBS) will celebrate its 22nd anniversary at the Vernon Club. Doors open at 6:00 pm with the music starting at 6:30 pm. Blues acts for this year's anniversary celebration include the winner of the 2010 KBS solo/duo contest Jimi V and Screamin' John. Jimi Vallandingham and John Hawkins will represent the KBS at the Blues Foundation's International Blues Challenge next February in Memphis. The Stray Cat Blues Band was a mainstay of Louisville blues venues in the 1970's and 1980's. The members of the Stray Cats have gone on to success with other bands but have recently reunited and will be at the Vernon on November 13. The closing act is The Shaun Murphy Band of Nashville, TN. Shaun Murphy sang lead vocals for the band Little Feat for sixteen years. She recently formed her own band and released her first CD entitled "Livin' the Blues" in September 2009. The Vernon Club is located at 1575 Story Ave. Admission is \$5.00 but free for KBS members.



On Saturday, November 13 the Kentuckiana Blues Society will celebrate its anniversary at the Vernon Club. It will be our 22nd anniversary and the third in a row that we've held at the Vernon. It might be tough to top last year's party but we've arranged for three excellent blues acts to give it a try. First up at 6:30 pm is Jimi V and Screamin' John. Jimi and John may be only one-half of The Predators but between them they put on a solid enough performance to win our solo/duo contest back in August. They will play a 45 minute opening set. At 7:45 pm the Stray Cat Blues Band will take the stage. These guys have been knocking around Louisville for over 30 years and most have gone on to other bands but they reunited last year to play the Big Rock Jazz Festival and did a turn on Kentucky Homefront earlier this year so it seemed like a good time to bring them to the Vernon. All the guys are still in the Louisville

area with the exception of Greg Martin who will make the trip from Glasgow, KY. The Stray Cats will play a 75 minute set until 9:00 pm. At 9:30 the Shaun Murphy Band from Nashville, TN will start a two-hour set. Growing up in Detroit, MI, Shaun Murphy signed her first record contract with a division of Motown. In the mid 1980's she started to record and tour with several top entertainers including Bob Seger, Joe Walsh, J.J Cale and Eric Clapton. In 1993 Murphy joined the band Little Feat and was the lead vocalist in the band for sixteen years until February 2009. Since then she has been recording and touring with her own band and released her first CD as the Shaun Murphy Band entitled "Livin' the Blues" in September 2009. As with all past KBS anniversary parties the admission is only \$5.00 but free for KBS members. Food will be available for purchase from FireFresh BBQ and the Vernon Club now has its liquor license so let the good times roll!



Janiva Magness The Devil Is An Angel Too Alligator Records

Toughness is Janiva Magness' trademark. Her story, at least by her fans, is familiar: tough teenage years in Detroit, Michigan, sometimes on the streets, others spent bouncing from foster home to foster home, and the blues music that literally saved--and changed--her life.

That toughness comes through on her latest CD: 12 songs which showcase her vocals and accompanying guitar from several musicians. And while it's also well-known that toughness served her well as she worked hard and upward in the music business and gained success, at times this CD takes the listener back to her

less-successful, grittier hardscrabble years. Janiva's emotion-drenched voice channels the grit and tenacity required to get through and overcome such challenges--perfectly suited to the material here.

Music Review

Joining Janiva on this CD are several multitalented individuals, not the least among them sound mixer, guitarist, keyboardist and backup vocalist Dave Darling. Key personnel also included are guitarists Zach Zunis and Jeff Turmes (the latter also on bass occasionally); bassist Gary Davenport; Ted Andreadis on keys and joined by Arlan Schierbaum on farfisa organ; Stephen Hodges on drums and percussion and Brie Darling, also on percussion and lending backup vocal support.

Surrounded by so much talent, Janiva is still allowed to remain out front; although many times guitar is heavily featured from the talented artists joining her.


As one might expect, many of these tunes are a bit gritty and dark, showing the difficult side(s) of life ("I'm Gonna Tear Your Playhouse Down," "Weeds Like Us," and the spooky-sounding opener and title track being among the most notable examples). There are a few, like the gentler and more sensual "I'm Feelin' Good" and the optimistic "Walkin' in the Sun" which lift the mood somewhat.

While the nod for best tune might go to the title track, they're all very, very good. Janiva has come to her calling honestly, the hard way and without compromise. What else could you expect but one great CD?!

Jimmy Dawkins Presents The Leric Story Jimmy Dawkins Delmark DE808

In the 1980s, blues guitar legend Jimmy Dawkins had his own record label, Leric Records. His goal was to give under-recognized Chicago blues artists a chance to record their songs. Leric Records released 45s from various artists. Unfortunately, along with other small record labels, Leric had to shut down due to tough economic times and the shift to a CD-based music market. *Jimmy Dawkins Presents, The Leric Story,* is Delmark Records' re-issue of some of the Leric 45s. This album gives us a great taste of the earlier efforts of artists who eventually went on to become successful performers and recording artists as well as those who never got a chance to break out. For those of you who collect historic blues recordings, this album is a must-have.

The first featured artist is Little Johnny Christian, who died in 1993 and sadly never received the recognition he deserved despite his large fan following in the south side Chicago clubs. He sings "New Life" and "Luv Sumbody," with backup artists that include Eddie "Jewtown" Burks on harmonica, Michael Coleman, Bob Fender, and Vance Kelly on guitar, and Erskine Johnson on piano and organ. Christian's velvet smooth vocals seamlessly blend with the band on both songs, and Vance Kelly's guitar and the horns are exceptional on "Luv Sumbody."

Tail Dragger sings the next two songs, "So Ezee" and his hit "My Head is Bald." Backing him are Eddie Burks again on harmonica, Johnny B. Moore and Jesse Lee Williams on guitar, Lafayette Leake on piano, and the late great Willie Kent on bass. Tail Dragger's trademark Howlin' Wolfish vocals are displayed to their best advantage on both songs, and the sound is mellow and rolls right along in an easy groove. Tail Dragger is still performing on Chicago's blues scene and has released other recordings on Delmark Records.

Queen Sylvia Embry died in 1992, and much like Little Johnny Christian, she also never achieved international recognition. She sings and plays bass on "I Know I Ain't Number One" and "Too Bad Baby." Her rich vibrato is complemented by Jimmy Dawkins himself on guitar. On both songs, Dawkins comes up with some great riffs, and his performance on "Too Bad Baby" is one of the most unique guitar solos I have ever heard.

Vance "Guitar" Kelly sings and plays guitar on "Use What You Got," "The Jam," and "Why You Hurt Me So Bad." Kelly has become one of the most successful blues artists on the Chicago scene, and he regularly plays to packed houses at Blues on Halsted, Rosa's Lounge, and other venues. In my humble opinion, Vance Kelly is one of the best living blues guitarists and vocalists still regularly performing. These three songs capture his early flair before his present crowd-pleasing style evolved. Erskine Johnson plays keyboards along with other unnamed artists and turns in an astounding performance on "The Jam." All three songs include some great keyboard and horn solos. Kelly's singing sounds effortless and silky smooth on all three selections, and his guitar playing is exceptional as always.

Nora Jean Bruso sings the next two songs, "Untrue Love" and "Oh My Love." In recent years, Nora Jean has become one of Chicago's most renowned female blues singers. Her rich powerful vocals are backed by Dawkins and Rich Kirch on guitars and Ray Scott on drums. The soulful "Oh My Love" especially showcases her crystal clear, soaring voice.

Bassist and singer Robert "Big Mojo" Elem, a former member of Freddie King's band, is yet another blues artist who died (in 1997) without ever achieving widespread fame. He sings "Special Kind of Love," with Jimmy Dawkins on guitar. It's too bad that only one of Elem's songs appears on the album, because "Special Kind of Love" is a great blend of Elem's singing and Dawkins instantly recognizable guitar style.

Little Johnny Christian is again featured on the next two songs, "Ain't Gonna Worry About Tomorrow" and "I Gotta Sad Feeling." The famous Chico Banks is the guitarist, and his clean crisp playing is tasteful and excitingly complex. An unknown keyboardist blew me away with an all-too brief solo on "Ain't Gonna Worry."

The late Sister Margot (or Lady Margot), a well-known singer who recorded albums on Delmark, ends the *The Leric Story* with the gospel favorites "My God is Real" and "Peace Be Still." Unfortunately, the other musicians on these cuts are unknown. Her bright shining voice is accompanied in true gospel fashion by a juicy organ sound on the first song and by a chorus on the second.

David Whiteis wrote the excellent liner notes, which evoke nostalgia for a bygone era. As Whiteis incisively puts it, this album "is what a Saturday night in Chicago sounded like at a neighborhood juke or show lounge during the 1970s and '80s." It was a time when great music was so easy to find on the rich Chicago blues scene that all you had to do was get yourself down to "the soul side of town." Sadly, those days are over, so we owe a huge debt of gratitude to Jimmy Dawkins and Delmark Records for preserving these songs.

Teresa James and The Rhythm Tramps You Know You Love It JesiLu Records

Twelve original tunes--tender, tough, gritty, greasy and honest--make up Teresa James and the Rhythm Tramps' latest CD.

And, while it could be argued that this group's most appealing stuff comes from the up-tempo songs featuring Teresa's nimble fingers on keys, Billy Watts' crisp guitar and the tightly wound rhythm section of Terry Wilson (Teresa's husband and also the CD's producer) and drummer Jim E. Christie, there's not a bad apple in the bunch. Overall, however, if you're looking for a pure blues CD, this does not usually hit the target. Perhaps the slower tunes might be bluesy enough to put it into that genre. Southern rock, bouncy, funky rock, with a blues influence--

that might be a better description.

This CD is in general a good mix of slow- mid-tempo and faster tunes that all have energy and solid production quality. And while this is a band--and an excellent one at that--Teresa's youthful gritty soprano is allowed to take front- and center stage most of the time. Although now based in Los Angeles, this southern girl's Houston, Texas roots still show with her slight twang, southern drawl, verbal mannerisms and ways of phrasing things. It's all good, of course. It's what gives her character. It's part of what makes her appealing.

Other key personnel joining Teresa and Company are drummer Tony Braunagel, percussionist Debra Dobkin (also on backup vocals) and the main horn "section" of Jerry Peterson and Lee Thornberg. They all add "icing" to an already delicious cake.

What else needs to be said?

Billy Lavender Memphis Livin' I65 Productions

With a large all-star guest lineup, Memphis native Billy Lavender's latest CD pays tribute to the city of his birth with a 14-song set of original soulful blues tunes.

Produced and engineered by Brad Webb, the overall effect is that of a very much "produced" CD with lots of work going into it. And with all the instruments and vocalists, lots of effort is needed. Webb has done a good job keeping it clean, crisp and allowing any featured artist to be out front when called for. Webb contributes guitar, sitar, bass and even back-up vocals.

Lavender is primarily a guitarist, having a lengthy career that first delved into rock music. Some of the more notable guests include sultry and powerful blueswoman Reba Russell on vocals and Russell Wheeler, who is prominently featured on the B3 organ throughout the CD.

The opener "Singin the Blues," sets the tone. It's a mid-tempo rock-blues groove with a greasy slide guitar (from Webb) snaking throughout the tune, as Lavender's stinging lead punctuates in just the right places. Driving, but smooth. Tony Adams' lead vocals are throaty and soulful. This is perhaps the best tune on the CD.

That tune's followed by "Let's Party," a jaunty toe-tapper led by Russell's somewhat toned-down (for her) vocals and featuring Blind Mississippi Morris on blues harp.

Another keeper is about midway down the list. "Blue" is where East meets West meets soul meets blues. Webb plays sitar in this slow, easy tune with some really sweet vocals by Russell and Jo-Jo Jeffries.

The last tune is a funky soul/rocker called "Delta" with Adams' growling voice leading the way over the vocalizing of Jeffries and Russell and Lavender's guitars providing the spice for the mood.

Overall, a good effort. Not dazzling or earth-shattering, but certainly worth keeping the dust off the cover and listening to on occasion.

Mitch Woods Gumbo Blues Club 88 Records

Mitch Woods is an accomplished pianist who has a predilection for boogie piano and in particular New Orleans boogie piano. This CD is a tribute to Smiley Lewis and the pioneers of New Orleans Rhythm and Blues. From the

first song, you get the flavor of the music for the rest of the CD. It is a funky, R&B boogie style that Woods' piano makes exceptional.

Woods' vocals are great on the CD. His piano is some of the best modern piano I have heard in quite some time. Not always flashy, but in the groove. The songs are mostly written by Dave Bartholomew and Antoin "Fats" Domino. Woods takes us back to the 1950's with this music and it is clearly party fun-time music, gumbo style.

Woods employs local musicians mostly associated with the original music. Herb Hardesty, the tenor man for Fats Domino is here, as well as Amadee Castenell (Allen Tousaint's sax player), John Fohl (Dr. John's Guitarist), Brian "Breeze" Cayolle on baritone and tenor sax, Cornell Williams on bass, and Eric Bolivar on drums.

You will probably recognize some songs on the CD such as "Too Many Drivers at the Wheel", covered by many bands including Hollywood Fats, written by Bartholomew, cut by Lewis in 1954 and was actually cut earlier than the Lewis version by Lowell Fulson.

If you are a fan of New Orleans music and/or like good piano blues, this CD is for you. I recommend it highly. Visit www. mitchwoods.com for sound clips.


