



The schedule is still coming together but the doors will open at 5:00 pm with an admission price of \$5 per person. The event is a benefit for the Animal Care Society (ACS) of Louisville. As part of Black History Month the Filson Historical Society will present its sixth annual "Blues Night at the Filson" on Friday, February 25. The Best Deal In Town

When the Kentuckiana Blues Society was birthed in 1988, the membership dues were a measly \$5.00 per person. that time our primitive newsletter was typed and pasted together at the offices of the Musicians Union Local 11-637 office. Members received the issues sporadically rather than monthly. In 1990 the dues were increased to \$7.00 while Rocky Adcock was still president. I was secretary and Foree Wells was treasurer. During the November 1991 Board Meeting a motion was made and approved to raise our annual membership to \$10.00 which went into effect January 1, 1992. This increase was to support the quality of the newsletter. On June 1, 1998 the dues were raised again to \$15.00 for a single membership and \$20.00 for a double. For 12 ½ years our dues have not changed, which is more than half the life of the KBS. When we reviewed the Society's income and expense finances at last December's Board meeting, it became apparent that the dues covered only 75% of the cost to print and mail our excellent monthly newsletter. Considering the circumstances of the escalating expenses, the board voted to increase the annual membership dues to \$20 for individual membership, \$25 for dual membership and \$30 for band membership. We are also considering a business membership in the \$100 to \$150 range with several advertising incentives. The increase will go into effect May 1, 2011, before the festival season begins. These next three months would be a great opportunity to join or renew while the low existing rates are still in effect. I was asked to justify this increase because of all the membership benefits that are currently available through the KBS. Because the KBS has held back raising the rates for so long, we are now catching up with what the other societies are charging for membership. With this increase we are matching what the Cincy Blues Society costs.

Now for the benefits:

- 2nd \$1 off admission for events at Stevie Ray's and Lisa's Oak Street Lounge
- 3rd Free admission to selected blues shows at Jim Porter's
- 4th 10% discount on all blues CD purchases at ear-X-tacy
- 5th 10% discount on gear and accessories purchased at Mom's Music (Mellwood Avenue)
- 6th 10% discount on purchases at Jimmy's Music Center (New Albany)
- 7th Two free tickets to the Louisville Blues-n-Barbecue Festival (Water Tower)
- 8th Free admission to the annual KBS Anniversary Party in November
- 9th Last but not least The camaraderie of attending a KBS Board Meeting the first Wednesday of each month at 7:00 PM in the backroom of Clifton's Pizza Co. (2230 Frankfort Avenue). Recently released CDs are distributed after the meeting for review in the newsletter. If you are willing to review one, you get to keep the CD.

If that is not the best deal in town, I don't know what is.

Robin Rogers, 1955–2010

Charlotte, North Carolina-based blueswoman Robin Rogers, whose short rise from regional to national artist captured the blues scene over the past couple of years, passed away in mid-December 2010 after a very brave, and public, battle with liver cancer. Readers of this newsletter already know that.

Why am I writing this? Well, perhaps I don't really know. I felt a strange, gut-level sadness upon learning of her illness, and her death affected me as well. Like her fans, I was drawn to her gusty, earthy and raw emotion when she sang. Unlike her fans, however, I could only read of her approachability and kindness. We never met. So, what gives?

Her latest CD, "Back in the Fire" pictures a seemingly happy, yet gaunt Robin on the front. The title seems appropriate to her life situation. I kept meaning to purchase it--never did. However, her previous CD, "Treat Me Right," is in my collection. It's one of my favorites--especially now.

The only "personal" contact (as personal as this gets these days) was a series of a few emails we exchanged perhaps a couple of years ago. I'd listened to (and I think reviewed for the KBS newsletter) "Treat Me Right" and was impressed and affected by her music. One song in particular, "Viola" for some reason touched a nerve. It told the story, in Robin's gritty, no-holds-barred fashion, of Viola Liuzzo (1925-1965), who was the first white woman killed during the American civil rights movement. Inspired by the efforts of African Americans in the South to obtain the right to vote, she left her home in Detroit and participated in the Selma-to-Montgomery, Alabama march for black voting rights in 1965. While shuttling marchers in her car, she was shot and killed by members of the Ku Klux Klan, a white supremacist organization determined to keep segregation alive.

I wrote to Robin to tell her how much I enjoyed the CD and especially that one tune. I can't even quite recall what either of us wrote in these few exchanges. All I know is, I just had to say something to her. Actually, while it will come as no surprise to some readers, I do this all the time--have done it for years, in fact. Only this time, it had a special meaning and looking back, I'm especially glad I did.





New Music Review!





Diamonds in the Dirt Joanne Shaw Taylor Ruf Records RUF1164

Taylor could well be called a diamond in the dirt herself, because her latest CD is well produced, professional and as gritty and blues-dirty as anything out there. Taylor's quitar is superb and her gutsy, earthy vocals

are perfect for her material.

The UK-based singer/guitarist wrote all 10 tunes, played all guitars and is the one and only vocalist. She can really do it all. She's joined by drummer Steve Potts, bassist Dave Smith and Rick Steff on keyboards.

Right away, adjectives start flooding the mind upon hearing the first notes out of Ms Taylor's throat. Gritty, haunted, earthy, soulful, dark, haunted, desperate. And that's a good thing: remember, she's a blueswoman. Those are positives in that genre.

One drawback for those who might like things a little more pure and "easier" sounding: Taylor's guitar chops, while excellent, often tend towards being a bit heavy-handed and rock-oriented. But when she pulls back and starts doing single note stuff, hitting those bluesy grooves with that sandpaper and silk voice, there's nobody better. And, one minor "disappointment" (this is a preference issue, nothing else) is that there's no slide guitar work on this CD. Her voice and music would lend itself perfectly to that.

The CD begins with "Can't Keep Living Like This" a spooky, smoky haunting tune with a simple beginning--a song about hard drinking and hard living. Well, it's the blues: Nothing new, right? Not so fast, there: Taylor is quite the lyricist, too: "Smoking to the filter/with heavy hearted breath/Dragging through my days/with gin soaked steps...and it's not that I don't care for living/I just can't keep living like this..."

"Dead and Gone" follows with a funky, stinging guitar groove right




out of the blocks--easily one of the best tunes on the CD. Tracks three and eight ("Same as it Ever Was" and "World on Fire") conjure up shades of the Allman Brothers. The title track is a nice melody, toned down a shade and anchored by some fat guitar tones. "Let it Burn" (7) is perhaps the purest blues tune due to the chord progression and beat.

All in all, this is an excellent recording. Plenty of grit and dirt and perfect vocals. (A) real diamond (s) in the dirt. Well titled!
