CeeCee James and her band will headline the Kentuckiana Blues Society's 23rd birthday party celebration November 19 at the Vernon Club. Born Christina James in Portland, Oregon, the Nashville-based blues and roots-rock artist began her musical journey in California, and released her first CD in 1999. The spiritual funk music of that recording eventually turned into blues as painful life experiences caused her to return to her birthplace, and musical roots, to create a new stage name and new life. CeeCee's powerful, emotional and soulful vocals and lyrics on subsequent CDs show she has come by her blues honestly. Also at the KBS birthday party, solo-duo contest winner Jimmy Davis will open the event; and he will be followed by band contest winner Little T&A. Further details in the November Blues News.

Letter From The Prez



The first annual Kentucky BBQ Festival in Danville, KY will have several blues acts on Saturday, November 5. The festival will also feature well-known pitmasters working their magic with pork shoulder, Texas beef brisket, whole hog and more. There will be barbecue demonstrations throughout the two day event. Saturday's blues acts include Big Poppa Stampley, Alien Blue, Johnny Roy & the Rubtones, da Mudcats and Little T&A. More information is available on-line at http://kentuckybbgfestival.com/.

The schedule is still coming together but the Kentucky Homefront show on Saturday, November 12 will feature all blues acts. John Gage and his crew have been scheduling a blues-related show twice a year at the Clifton Center auditorium. One show takes place in

the spring and the other takes place in the fall. As soon as the lineup is set we will have it on the KBS website and you will be able to find it at the Kentucky Homefront website at http://www.kentuckyhomefront.org/.

We hope to have the KBS Youth Contest on Sunday, October 16 at the Willis Music on Shelbyville Rd. As we were going to press with the October issue of *Blues News* we have not received any applications for the contest. We've had trouble in the past getting kids interested in competing in our blues competition. If you have any ideas about helping the blues society develop a plan to get more musicians under the age of 21 interested in the blues, please contact me at prez@kbsblues.org or give me a call at 502/724-9971. I would love to hear from you.

The Kentuckiana Blues Society is currently in third place to win a free concert by Moreland & Arbuckle. The blues society that receives the most votes by November 30 wins a complimentary 45 minute performance by the Wichita, KS blues duo. The contest is sponsored by Telarc and the Blues Foundation and votes can be placed on-line at http://www.telarc.com/justadream/. Only one vote per computer so every votes counts.

He just celebrated his 86th birthday on September 16 but legendary blues performer B.B. King is still on the road and playing the blues with his band. He is scheduled to appear at the Louisville Palace on Thursday, October 13. Tickets are \$50 and \$65 and can be purchased at the Palace box office or on-line via ticketmaster. The following month blues guitarist Joe Bonamassa will be at the Palace on November 15. Tickets for that show are \$52 and \$82.

After just losing bluesman David "Honey Boy" Edwards on August 29, Willie "Big Eyes" Smith passed away on September 16. Smith was a member of Muddy Waters' band in the 1960's and Edwards performed regularly with his friend and fellow bluesman Robert Johnson and was with him the night he was poisoned and died. Both musicians played the festival circuit together and I've seen them several times at the Chicago Blues Festival. Smith last appeared in our area in September of 2010 at Jim Porter's and Edwards was a headliner at the 2008 Master Musicians Festival in Somerset, KY. Our deepest sympathies go out to their family, friends and numerous fans around the world.

We went down on Wednesday this year, giving us time to get settled into our motel rooms and have an extra day to visit Bruce at Simon's Shoes. The ladies sure do like their selections and prices. We stop at Wilkerson's Shoes, too. Our usual itinerary includes: Gene's for breakfast every day. (It's so hard not to buy one o' them pies with the foot high Meringue piled on top.) Abba's Music Store to see what he's got this year. And Rookies Sports Bar for a Black Angus filet!

Wednesday: First group on Wednesday night was a 2 man band calling themselves *THE COLD STARES*. Guitar and drums. A very interesting concept; they sounded good, but I was too surprised to write down anything that they did. I'll bet we see more of these guys later. Wednesday night at seven was a perennial favorite – *THE AMAZING SOUL CRACKERS* – featuring Tommy Stillwell of much guitar fame. He was out of the chute with *Crossroads*, quickly tuned into *Sunshine of Your Love*, *Black Cat Bone*, and wooed us all with a cut from Omar & The Howlers *Loud Mouthed Woman* which allowed Tommy the chance to show off some of his great slide work. They closed with *The Beverly Hillbillies* theme song. Walter, of The Larrys and Walt, was seen talking to Tommy before the show. I expected that a request was made. Walt had to wait for the encore to get his wish. Tommy and crew did VOODOO CHILD as good as you've heard it done – it didn't rain nor lightning - and they got to finish it.

Thursday: There were 2 workshops scheduled. We managed to miss both of them. We were too late for Dennis Stroughmatt, the Creole fiddler, and by the time Matt Schofield was able to get there – we were back in our seats on the riverbank. Thursday night is always ZYDECO night. We ate red beans and rice and alligator tails and corn dogs with mudd puppie sauce and had a big ole time listening and dancing to music provided first by Dennis Stroughmatt & Creole Stomp, and then by Terrance Simien and the Zydeco Experience. All is quiet and normal and then Matt Schofield took the stage. I have heard people say that some guitar players "had made a deal with the devil", or "were possessed by one or more devils" and that is why they played so far above the rest of us. After listening to Mr. Schofield play his couple of hours live on the Handy stage – I decided that he must be in charge of several devils – driving them to make the sounds that we all heard that night. I'll say no more. See this guy LIVE someplace sometime for an ULTIMATE experience.

Friday: Damon Fowler – this young man plays a variety of instruments: guitar, dobro, lap steel, slide guitar - and does it all very well – Delta blues, country blues, hot blues, Chicago blues – it's all in there. It is most interesting to watch him play. Sample his wares at Blind Pig records. The CD we picked up is *DEVIL GOT HIS WAY*. Next we saw the Deanna Bogart Band. Good as usual with their brand of blues and Jazz. We said goodnight as Guitar Shorty was getting the crowd warmed up.

Saturday: EDEN BRENT – one of the performers I knew that I wanted to see. She sat there at her piano and did most every style you could think of from boogie woogie to a "women's lib" song where she gave her live-in \$20.00 more than he asked for to go buy supper, but with the request that he "just keep on going and not come back." Discovery of Saturday: Lionel Young Band. CD: LYB/IBC SESSIONS, ON OUR WAY TO MEMPHIS. This six man band could play for 8 hours and I would still cry out for more. Cause time stands still sometimes. Blues and Boogie: from Roosevelt Sykes, thru T-Bone Walker, Freddie King, Magic Sam, Sam Cooke and Mr. Morganfield – they leave no stone unturned. Sample them at www.dexofon.com or www.lionelyoung.net. Carolyn Wonderland. I had ordered a CD by this lady when I saw her on the SUN SESSIONS one Saturday night (WDRB channel 41). She was playing an electronically driven lap steel – and I liked the sound. I thought she was a newcomer. Then I find out that not only has she played all over Texas forever, but she has also played Sturgis for the last 10 years straight. She is good. She has a multi-talented guitar style and vocals. www.carolwonderland.com. Cut #10 on the Bloodless Revolution CD that I bought is: "From a Waffle Booth Six". I didn't get it signed as she tried to pass out right after her show. They kept her in air conditioning past the time we could wait for her to come back out to sign. Charles Walker was playing as we started for the car, and we could hear John Primers with Lurrie Bell and Eddie Shaw playing as we drove off. (The line for Java Shakes and good company delayed our walk out of the park!)

Sunday: Stop-to-shop in Evansville and as is our usual the ladies started out for clothes. I headed to Border's Books, only to find that they had gone out of business. What a sad thing to have had happen. It's like we've lost another piece of art work. It was a great weekend at the WC HANDY festival again, and we are looking forward to next year.

Trampled Underfoot Wrong Side of The Blues VizzTone/TUF Records

Schnebelen siblings Danielle, Kris and Nick, of Kansas City, Missouri, do a great job continuing their parents' legacy as blues musicians and taking the music past where they found it. The 2008 International Blues Challenge winners continue to show they richly deserved the honor with "Wrong Side of the Blues," (published by a partnership of TUF and VizzTone Records), which is produced by veteran drummer

Tony Braunagel.

Twelve original songs get to the heart of the blues and then some. Braunagel's skilled production, ably assisted by engineer/ guest vocalist/guitarist Johnny Lee Schell, is punctuated by his co-writing of several songs on the set list. The trio sings one tune ("Evil Train") written by their late father, Bob, and are also joined by their mother Lisa Swedlund, on background vocals on several numbers. Legendary blues harpist Kim Wilson is featured on "She's Long, Tall and Gone," and Mike Finnigan's work on keyboard and piano can be heard throughout the recording.

Nick, on guitar, Kris on drums and the other half of the rhythm section, bassist Danielle, are still in their 20s, but show a musical maturity well beyond their years. Sounding like seasoned pros, yet exhibiting passion and grit, they perform every song as if they were once again onstage at the IBC and their careers depended on it.

Right out of the blocks, the CD starts with a standard-style blues tune called "Get It Straight," that is delivered with authority. That's followed by one of the two best songs on the list, "Bad Woman Blues." Introduced with an acoustic slide guitar riff, this toe-tapper has a driving beat featuring one of the brothers as lead vocalist (the liner notes don't indicate which one is doing the lead singing), and sounding like Doyle Bramhall II-meets-Keb Mo'--not a bad combination.

Speaking of vocals, any review of this group's work must emphasize Danielle's powerful singing. This young woman has some pipes, for sure! She's always soulful, can be gitty, yet even when pushing the edge, never strains or struggles to keep it together – a powerhouse with amazing control. Mother and daughter, in fact, provide a wonderful vocal package for this little band.

The title track and the aforementioned "She's Long, Tall and Gone," are some of the more traditional-sounding blues songs, while "The Fool" (track 7) is sparse, minor key and very rootsy in flavor. All the songs are excellent, and one other bears mentioning as it perhaps is in a tie for "best-of" on this set. "Have a Real Good Time," (track 8) starts out with a drum riff that sounds much like Led Zeppelin's "Been a Long Time", and it's every bit as instrumentally and vocally rowdy. This song is apparently the trio's story of their "unexpected" IBC win in 2008. Including a bit of slide guitar, strong, wailing vocals and enthusiastic piano-pounding courtesy of Finnigin's flying fingers, this tune is the most energetic of them all.

"Wrong Side of the Blues" is everything that's RIGHT with the blues, and it invites, no, compels you, to keep listening and truly enjoy it. You can't help it. As the lyrics from track 8 say: "...There's something goin' on...and if you come and hang out with us, you'll have a real good time." Absolutely!

Damon Fowler Devil Got His Way Blind Pig Records

Blues music is stylistically all over the map these days, especially with younger artists. Damon Fowler's latest CD is a perfect example.

The mid-20s musician, who sings with an expressive voice and plays a mean lap slide guitar, wrote 10 of the dozen tunes on his latest CD "Devil Got His Way" -- and as far as pure blues is concerned, the title is perhaps one of the blue-siests thing about it.

The CD opens with a blues-rock number, and includes tunes that are funky, ballad-like, and country rock. There's even a drinking song (closing tune) and -- get this -- a country/swing/Hawaiian guitar style/blues song (track 7). Blues purists will find little to identify with.

That being said, however, this is a good CD. It's well-produced, allowing Fowler's vocals to be out front when necessary, and the warm, fat tone of his slide is often reminiscent of that of Derek Trucks (not a bad comparison!) -- only richer and a bit "darker." The best-sounding tunes employ his greasy, low-down 'h' dirty slide: track 2 (title) and "28 Degrees" (track 5).

Fowler has strong blues influence, for sure; although it's probably more accurate to say he tends toward more roots and electric southern soul with some country elements thrown in for good measure. It'll be interesting to see what Fowler does with a more literal/traditional definition of blues music in future recordings.

Bryan Himes Demons and Whiskey Inside Sounds

With this title you expect the blues and your expectations are met.

I enjoyed the CD from start to finish. Himes is a great story teller, singer, and guitar player and represents his Kentucky roots. The musicianship is delightful, from strumming and foot tapping to solo side guitar to picking that challenges a mandolin. Singing with great abandon and not holding back, track 2, "Take My Sickness" raises the

rafters and makes you just get on your feet. Much of the lyrical content is thought provoking and nontrivial. There are 10 songs total on this CD, with 3 being listed as "bonus". The whole CD should be coined that, not just the 3. Pick this CD up and support great blues.

Ghost Town Blues Band Dust the Dust Inside Sounds

This CD, released in 2010, features Matt Isbell on guitars, harmonica, vocals, organ and clavichord, Dusty Sikes on bass, and Preston McEwen on drums. The group which is from Memphis, plays blues rock, and has recorded a few good ones here like "One More Whiskey". They also play a few covers that detract from the CD, or at least don't meet the standards of their originals, like the Beatles tune "Come Together", "C.C. Rider" and "Goin' Down".

Other than those three, the songs are fair rock songs. The musicianship is very good and the recording is good as well.

As for the blues, only one song stands out -"Suga Mama", a slow blues tune that I liked. Other songs like "Baby Please Don't Go" could be a Van Halen release. "I Put a Spell On You" is another slow-ish song but with crazy vocal effects and heavily distorted guitar. You can check out the music and buy some, at www.ghosttownbluesband.bandcamp.com.

My rating on this CD is fair- not bluesy enough for me.
