


Future of the Blues

Letter From the Prez



On Saturday, November 29, a New Orleans-style funeral was held at 122 West Main Street in Louisville, KY to bid adieu to a good friend who had been around for 79 years. There were a few tears but mostly songs and stories as our blues community said goodbye to Zena's Cafe. The bar had more people in it that night than I had ever seen at any other time - a testament to the fact that this blues cafe touched the lives of many in our city. The Pure Gravel Band, Lamont Gillispie & 100 Proof Blues, the Clay Street Blues All Stars, Tanita Gaines, Tim Krekel and a few other guest performers provided the music for the evening. The last band stopped playing at around three in the morning and when I looked at my cell phone just before I walked out the door it was a few minutes before 6 am. Who cared? It was the last night and no one wanted it to end. I will have more to say about Zena's closing night with photos from the evening in a future edition of *Blues News* but right now I just want to say thank you Mary Jean Zena. Thank you Randy Zena. Thank you Larry and Corrine and everyone who worked over the years to keep this great blues bar alive. Like a good friend you will missed and you will bring a smile to our faces when we stop and think about you.

Photo by Bob Brown Apparently the blues gods are not quite done with that location near the corner of 2nd and Main streets. Local restaurateur Scott Risinger has leased the space previously occupied by Zena's and has plans to open a blues cafe in the very near future. Tentatively titled "Harley's Blues Cafe", (Harley is Scott's first name), the bar will feature a mix of blues, sports and food. Scott said that's a given with the new Louisville Arena going up practically across the street. "I want the place to be cool and gritty," Scott said. He plans to clean it up a little but keep the feel of a blues bar. "I want the construction workers from the arena site to feel like they can walk in here with their dusty boots on and be comfortable." Scott and his wife Sharon have a lot of experience starting new venues in town. They've opened several restaurants and bars including the Third Avenue Cafe, the Highland Tap Room and the Bluegrass Brewing Company in Theater Square among others. They currently own and operate the Amici Cafe in Old Louisville. Scott said he wants to bring the food up a notch and slowly expand throughout the building and the back courtyard area. In fact, he is looking for investors to get involved in this project. He plans to sells shares at \$400 apiece with a minimum purchase of 10 shares or \$4,000 per investor. With this financial assistance Scott wants to make improvements to the building and eventually open the second and third floors for business. Interested parties can reach him at 639-7135. Your Blues Society has thrown a birthday party for its members, (guests welcome), for years. We found a place that would have us, hired a band, supplied food for free, and let members in free – charging guests a minimal fee. No matter how few members or guests showed up, the bands always played like they were playing to a full house and those present (usually not over 30 of us) ate until we were full and still had pizza or BBQ to take home with us. Fun for the few, but the majority missed out on a good birthday bash.

For the 20th Birthday Party, President Sampson - still strong after Delilah had done her job - decided that this year would be different. We rented the newly renovated Vernon Club (located downstairs at Louisville's oldest bowling alley, the Vernon Lanes on Story Avenue, both of which date back to the 1880's). You could dance, drink beer, and watch the bowling balls roll across the ceiling on their way back to their throwers. There was plenty of well-lit parking, a covered outdoor smoking area and a cash bar. One difference was that the food was not provided for free, but was available on a cash basis. Chef JT's Smokin' Spice BBQ provided scrumptious rib tips, pork sausages, brisket sandwiches, chicken and grilled fish, with baked beans, mixed greens and potato salad. The money we saved on food (and then some) went towards not one, but TWO regional bands, along with some extra advertising, which you may have noticed in several papers around town or heard on WFPK. You may also have seen the color posters at ear-X-tacy or in cafes, music stores and other places around town.

A presentation of the history of the society and its peoples played in the side room all night, via a slide show prepared by Blues News editor extraordinaire Natalie. Pictures and memorabilia were supplied by group members and friends, including KBS blues curmudgeon emeritus Keith Clements and former Blues News editor Paul Schneider. A very interesting show covering a 20 year history.

Music for the night was provided by Miss Lissa and Company from Dayton, OH and by the Beat Daddys from Nashville, by way of Mississippi and Evansville, IN. Instead of 30 people, we had over 200 enthusiastic guests, including at least 6 Sylvester Weaver Award winners. A great time was had by all, and if you were there, I think you will agree that we gave your Blues Society a 20th Birthday party worth remembering. Thanks to all who attended and to all the individuals who acted as a group to pull this thing off.

Live at Rosa's Blues Lounge Little Arthur Duncan Delmark DVD DE-793

This is the newest in a growing list of DVD's that Delmark has recorded in Chicago clubs to give those of us who are not so fortunate to live in the windy city. It is another great recording, this time of Little Arthur Duncan, who grew up in Indianola Mississippi, just down the road from Muddy Waters.

There are 16 tracks on the DVD in addition to a Little Arthur Commentary. The band consists of Little Arthur Duncan (His father was Big Arthur)vocals and harmonica, Illinois Slim on Guitar, Rick Kreher on second guitar, Michael Azzi on bass, Twist Turner on drums and Little Al Thomas, vocals on one song.

Duncan brought the Mississippi blues to Chicago with him in 1954, after living in Florida for about 4 years. He and Earl Hooker, who he met in Florida, made the trip to Chicago together. He honed his harp skills while in Chicago listening to Billy Boy Arnold, and Carey Bell, and played around town.

Duncan was a construction worker and bought a Chicago club to keep him occupied during the construction shut down of the winters. He owned the Artesia Lounge on Lake Street and later the Backscratcher's on West Madison Street. During that period he booked a lot of good acts but rarely performed himself outside his own club. A landlord problem with the club eventually shut the club down, but gave Duncan the chance to start performing again himself.


Duncan is decidedly not a great singer-his voice doesn't have the rough hewn deep blues that mark a lot of blues vocals. His delivery, however, makes up for any lack of range of his voice. Listening to him sing (and listening to his commentary) one can tell that he is still just a good ol' Mississippi country boy.

Most of the songs are covers, but they are all of the type that suites Duncan's style and fit him well, starting out with his original "Leaving Mississippi". Other songs include "Mean Old Frisco" by Arthur Crudup, "Little Red Rooster" by Willie Dixon, "Blues with a Feeling" by Little Walter, and others. The band's performance is excellent and the recording is in Delmark's usual flawless style.

This is yet another DVD to add to your blues collection.

Ice Storm Scott Ellison Earwig Records 739788495622

Scott Ellison hails from Tulsa Oklahoma, not normally considered a hotbed of blues music. It was Tulsa that introduced him, however, to Eric Clapton's and Freddie King's bands. Ellison began touring in 1977 as a guitar player for Jessica James (Conway Twitty's daughter). In 1981, Ellison was tapped by Gatemouth Brown and by the 90's, he had his own blues band and was opening for bands like the Fabulous Thunderbirds, Bobby Bland and Buddy Guy. He considers opening for B.B. King,

the highlight of his career.

Ellison's guitar based blues rock is better than most that fit into that category. There is more blues here than rock and his use of guitar is appropriate for the vocals and he doesn't overdo it with searing guitar licks. Instead, his tasteful chops accent the beat and add fills for the vocals.

There are 12 songs on the CD, all originals by Ellison. The rest of the band, unfortunately, are too numerous to mention-23 musicians, 6 background vocalists and two horn sections. It is to his credit, though, that Ellison keeps his "identity", or sound, with such a large accompanying group.


