The blues festival season got off to a soggy start when rain interrupted the beginning of the Jeffersontown-Crusade Blues Bash on Friday, May 15. However it was just a brief delay to wait out the storms moving through our area. The show eventually started and we were able to enjoy the music of The Flying Saucers, Big Black Cadillac and Sue O'Neil & Blue Seville. Our thanks to the Fraternal Order of Eagles for being our host that evening. Thanks also to the sponsors of the festival including Kentucky Telco, Kentucky Farm Bureau, the city of Jeffersontown and the J-Town Chamber of Commerce, the Louisville Music Charities, Inc and of course the Kentuckiana Blues Society. Unfortunately the rain continued through the night and by Saturday morning Veterans Memorial Park took on the appearance of a Louisiana swampland. The decision was made to postpone the event and as we go to press a make-up date has not been determined.

It did continue to rain off and on throughout the day Saturday but this did not interrupt the Pitt Academy BBQ and Blues Festival. A large white tent was erected on the grounds of the academy for the barbecue and it provided plenty of cover for the bands and the blues fans in attendance. The Here for the Party Band from Lexington, KY, da Mudcats and Harmonica Red and the New Heard provided excellent blues music during the course of the afternoon and evening. A blues jam was held at the end of the night with several of the days musicians joining in and a few special guests including Denny Thornbury on harp and Mike Trobaugh on guitar.

The show at Pitt Academy was a great send off for Harmonica Red. Red, aka George Heard, is leaving Frankfort and returning to his native Louisiana. Red was displaced by Katrina almost four years ago and he is going home to take a teaching position in the state's school system. Red said that he will still be able to perform and should make it back to Kentucky occasionally. We have greatly enjoyed having him here and take some pride in the fact that Red's 2008 release "I Was Born in Louisiana" was voted one of the top ten best self-produced CD's by the Blues Foundation after being nominated by the Kentuckiana Blues Society. Good luck Red. We'll miss you.

Applications are still coming in for our blues contests. As long as we receive at least five entries in each category we will hold the band competition at Stevie Ray's on Sunday, June 14 and the solo/duo competition at Lisa's Oak Street Lounge on Sunday, June 28. I have also received several emails from young blues performers who want to take part in a youth competition. If we can find some sponsorship and the right venue we will try and make this happen. Stay tuned.

Don't forget this month's regional blues festivals including the Handy Blues and Barbecue Festival (www.handyblues.org) in Henderson, Ky June 13 to June 20, the Smokin' on the River festival (www.smokinontheriver-jeff-in.com/) June 19 and June 20 in Jeffersonville, IN and the Blues, Boats & BBQ Fest (www.statedock.com/) Saturday, June 20 at Lake Cumberland, KY.

Due to the fact that we keep running into scheduling conflicts at O'Shea's Irish Pub the Kentuckiana Blues Society is going to move its monthly board meetings to another location. We appreciate the suggested locations we have received and will review all as a possible new home for the KBS. New Music Reviews!



Alphabet Blues **Rod Piazza and the Mighty Flyers** **Black Top Records**

I recently purchased this re-release of Piazza's 1992 release, originally on Black Top Records. I am a fan of Rod Piazza, but only have his more recent releases, including the DVD "Big Blues Party". So purchasing this older release was a natural thing for me, but I am also testing a theory of mine.

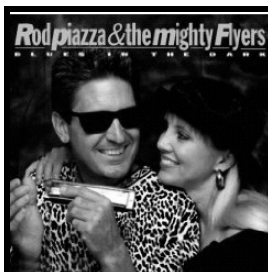
My (scientific) theory is that most musical groups tend to be more creative in their earlier years. This theory is not without its challengers. For example, a first release is creative as all new artists have that "newness" to them that soon wears off (in the listener's perspective) on all but the most creative and talented musicians.

So if one likes music from a band that has been around for years, chances are the older music will be good if not better than the newer releases.

So...I purchased the CD and was I ever pleased. There are some great tunes on this CD including slow blues –"Nights End" is a real gem-, rollicking tunes, great piano from Honey Piazza and my favorite blues instrument- the harmonica. The guitar work on the CD can't be ignored either and reminds me of some of Hollywood Fats work. This is a great CD. All 15 songs were played on my CD player multiple times.

Did I prove my theory? No, but I intend to purchase other older blues CD's to either prove this theory or else build a blues music library- in the name of science of course.

Blues in the Dark **Rod Piazza and the Mighty Flyers** **Hepcat Records**

I am still trying to prove my theory. This is the second purchase I made of Piazza's re-releases- another one originally on Black Top and now on Hepcat. I received the CD, popped it in the CD player and gave it a listen. There are 12 tracks on the CD and another 3 "Bonus Tracks". The music was recorded in 1992 about the same time as "Alphabet Blues" was. Original liner notes grace the CD inside, the same as "Alphabet Blues" It is interesting to get the take on the music from back then, almost as interesting as the music is.

I have to tell you-this music is good the first time you pop it into the CD player, but it gets better each time I listen to it. This is excellent blues music and a great recording. For west coast blues lovers- sorry this is not just for you. This has the appeal that all blues music lovers will like. I am a convert to west coast blues because of Rod.

For a re-mastering effort , this is as good as it gets. It is easy to see why the label thought it was worth the effort in re-mastering and re-releasing the CD.

Artists on this CD include Rod, Piazza on vocals and harmonica, Honey Alexander (later Piazza) on piano, Alex Shultz on guitar, Bill Stuve on bass and Jimmy Bott on drums. Some, but not all, of these songs are originals but they are all originally performed. There is a Piazza touch to them all.

If you don't have the vinyl, you need this plastic.

Slide to Freedom 2: Make a Better World **Doug Cox & Saili Bhatt** **Northern Blues**

Like fusion music? Like Blues? Like Indian music? Answer yes to only one of these questions, and you're guaranteed to at least enjoy a "third" of this CD. Chances are, however, that even the most diehard traditional blues lover will find something to like about this amazingly well-produced CD--and probably all of it.

First, however, for those of you who aren't familiar, an explanation is in order:

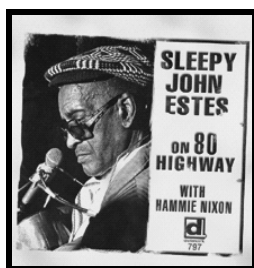
Bhatt is a young Mohan Veena player and son of the legendary Grammy Award-winning musician Vishwa Mohan Bhatt, who created the original instrument named after himself called a "Mohan Veena" some 30 years ago--an invention hailed as a unique discovery. Basically, the instrument has 19 strings in all, including three for the main melody, five "drone" and 12 "sympathetic" strings. The neck and head-stock, as well as the tuning keys, are huge (in comparison to a traditional guitar). Bhatt the Younger has re-tooled his father's instrument, named it the "Sativik Veena" and tweaked it with some of his own design and utilized 100-year-old oak, pine and rosewood materials for superior sonic resonance.

Bhatt is joined by Doug Cox, one of Canada's premiere slide guitarists; and they are joined by up-and-coming vocalist John Boutte. They create music that is virtually timeless with the combination of country blues and the Indian ragas alongside Boutte's more "funky" soulful, New Orleans-style of singing.

Even the title, "Slide to Freedom," is apropos, because as Eastern neo-traditional sound meet Western roots-n-blues, it becomes an "act of liberation from the conventions of the blues," as the CDs press material states.

And, while it may sound a bit cliché, while listening to this, well, the world does seem to be a better place.

On 80 Highway
Sleepy John Estes with Hammie Nixon
Delmark Records DE 797

This music was recorded in 1974 and until recently (October 2008), had not been released. John Adams Estes, born in 1899 was nicknamed "Sleepy" John Estes supposedly because of his ability to sleep standing up. In the early 1920's he teamed with Yank Rachell and Hammie Nixon to tour the Brownsville Tennessee area where they hailed from.

Estes' vocals hark back to the period when he worked railroad maintenance as a work gang leader vocally setting the pace for work. He was not an accomplished guitarist, but his vocals are what set him apart from others. His voice, full of loss, despair, and loneliness - is the blues. Estes lived in poverty and perhaps his life experience makes his music more real.

Hammie Nixon was born Hammie Nickerson in 1908 in Brownsville Tennessee. He performed with Estes for over 50 years and first recorded with Estes in 1929. He played harmonica, kazoo and jug. This CD demonstrates Nixon's exceptional ability on the harmonica.

Though Estes passed away in 1977 and Nixon in 1984, their music still has a following because of its authenticity and unique style.

This CD has 17 "cuts" on it (two of the cuts are the two of them talking which is actually a segue into the songs that follow) and consists of only the two men in the studio. Estes plays acoustic guitar and sings while Nixon sings, plays harp and kazoo. For me, one of the standout tracks is "Potato Digging Man", a tune penned by Yank Rachell. The title track, "On 80 Highway" is the longest song on the CD at 4:55 and intrigued me due to the somewhat hard to understand lyrics. I listened to the song several times to catch the words.

"IGA" is another favorite of mine. It is a song about the grocery store (Independent Grocers Association) and has the repetition of the phrase "Check 'em out" with the background bass string beat that is real catchy. Two songs on the CD are different takes on the same song titled "President Kennedy" and another two are in the gospel music vein ("Holy Spirit" and "Do Lord Remember Me" the latter of which includes a group clapping to accompany the music).

This CD is not for everybody. It is authentic country blues from one of the best crooners and best harp masters from a time gone by that will never be replicated. This is not a CD to pop into the car CD player, because you will not catch the nuances or lyrics of the songs. This is one that you play at home with the headphones on.

Debris
Michelle Malone
SBS Records

It's not quite clear from press materials just why Michelle Malone's 10th CD is titled "Debris." Such a word conjures up images of various and sundry scattered things, chaos, stuff flyin' everywhere. Perhaps "high-energy" could also be associated with it, and that, among other noteworthy positive things, is certainly an ingredient in "Moanin'" Michelle's latest release.

True-blue traditionalists might not want to label this Georgia roots-rocker a blueswoman--and technically, they'd be mostly correct. However, there's plenty here to like and enough low-down grit to put this on your blues shelf.

Malone's signature gut-wrenching wail, ferocious bottleneck swooping slide, blues harp and aforementioned energy are the perfect channel for her gospel, rock and soul-driven roots, combined with enough blues elements to, as her press release says, "keep the devil satisfied." Malone delivers with passion and conviction on every tune, whether searing, gritty electric blues or more soulful, stripped-down ballad-like acoustic tunes.

While this is definitely a Malone trademark CD, serious mention must go to a woman named Trina Meade, listed as a backup singer on the credits in the liner notes. On the second track "Yesterday's Make Up" (which will get a bit more mention shortly), Meade lends some searing, gorgeous soul-shaking grit of her own and practically burns the house down near the end of the song. This M&M duet will give you goosebumps. From the sound of this, Meade should've been allowed to take the vocal lead on several tunes.

Other tunes which stand out are the opening "Feather in a Hurricane", a searing social comment anchored by Malone's passionate vocals and scorching slide; "Chattahoochee Boogaloo;" and the funky, bluesy, tough-talkin' strut of "Restraining Order Blues" which is likely Malone's most fundamentally bluesy tune of all the eleven.

Back to the previously mentioned "Yesterday's Make Up." While other tunes also showcase Malone's skill with the lyric, this one perhaps does it best: "The sun shines through my party dress/I look like summer but I feel so blessed/The congregation turns while I walk through the door/My heel click-clackin' on a marble floor/Well, it's Sunday mornin' in my Saturday dress/Yes...And I feel beautiful in yesterday's makeup...I look like Cinderella on her way home/I feel like Wonder Woman, righteous and strong/The preacher keeps preachin' bout heaven on high/I wanna say 'amen, that's where I was last night/Well, it's Sunday mornin' in my Saturday dress...."

With that image in mind, suffice to say this CD will have you shoutin' "amen" from the rafters...

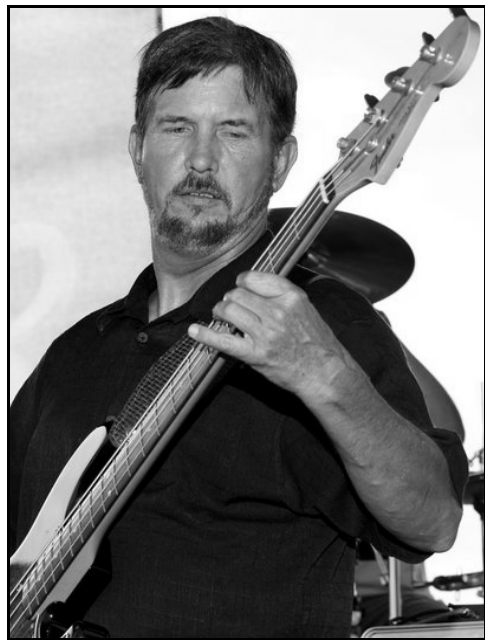
What Type of Music Do You Play?
