- You realize that the cheers from the audience after a particularly difficult passage are for a sports play on the big screen TV over the bar and that in fact no one is listening to you.
- When the gig you drove 200 miles for to make \$100 and had to pay for a hotel room is later referred to as your "summer tour."
- When your most sincere, heartfelt comments are made by people that are drunk and who won't remember you in the morning.
- When you are repeatedly told that the lead singer who can't read, never practices and has been singing for only six months is "the strongest part of the band" primarily because she has a nice rack.
- When you are pleased that the pay for the gig, when looked at hourly from the time you leave your house to when you return, meets minimum wage.
- When someone comes up to you to tell you how much they love your playing because they didn't think anyone played those songs anymore.
- You get to the gig to find out that nothing is comped and you're charged \$10 to park.
- When someone seeks you out to complement your playing as the "best sax player they have ever heard" and you're the trumpet player.
- You aren't offended when all of the young wedding guests leave after the second set to dance to the DJ at a club down the street.

- When people tell you that you are a great musician and the best they have ever heard but refuse to pay more than \$5 at the door.



## **New Music Reviews!**





## Dave Riley and Bob Corritore Lucky to be Living Blue Witch Records

Dave Riley, a native of Hattiesburg Mississippi, joined Bob Corritore, a native of Chicago, 5 years ago and formed a personal and professional relationship. Riley played guitar while in the army during the Vietnam era, and more recently with the Jelly Roll Kings. On this CD, he plays guitar and handles all of the vocals. Corritore plays harmonica and produced the CD as he did their first effort, *Travelin' the Dirt Road*.

Although this is yet another guitar/harp duo (reference Cephas and Wiggins, Sonny Terry and Brownie McGhee and others), the music is unique and Riley's gravelly voice gives it a dimension not heard from the others. Corritore's fills complement the guitar and Riley's voice well.

The best song on the CD in my estimation is "Sharecropper's Blues" in which only Riley's guitar and vocals and Corritore's harp tell the story. This, the longest track on the CD, will make you wish it were longer still. All ten cuts are winners though. Although this CD has been billed more as a Delta blues CD, I would classify it more as Chicago blues. Four of the songs were written by Frank Frost of the Jelly Roll Kings, and the first song on the CD is a tribute to those folks who helped Riley become who he is today, all of which are now gone.

The Title track is a Frank Frost song that the duo felt needed to be recorded because of all of the recently departed elder musicians, they feel "Lucky to be Living".

This CD will be a good addition to your collection, and they would be a great group to see live. Currently, they are performing oversees. Check out music clips at www.myspace.com/daverileybobcorritore.

## Fiona Boyes Blues Woman Yellow Dog Records 1653

Boyes has released her second CD on the Yellow Dog label and is joined by Watermelon Slim, Marcia Ball, and Pinetop Perkins. Boyes has again deftly showcased her songwriting and guitar playing skills. The 15 songs on the CD are a combination of styles from Chicago blues to Mississippi Hill Country blues with presumably Australian flourishes.

Boyes guitar playing is quite amazing, if you have ever seen her. She finger picks, but it does not sound like it. Pinetop Perkins said of her "I ain't never heard a woman finger pick a guitar like that since Memphis Minnie" and, "She's got it. I've played with them all, and she's got it." On "A Place of Milk and Honey", Boyes lets her acoustic slide work get you toe tapping. The song rings true with her and laments the ability to make money in the music business. She notes that if you have ever priced a trans-Pacific flight, you know what she is talking about when she says that "If I don't make some money, I can't go back home." Another song, inspired by Bobby Rush (you can probably guess from this alone that it is filled with double entendre) called "Fishin' Hole" is filled with excellent resonator playing by Boyes.

Boyes' music is original, well performed and diversified. There is only one thing that seems to not grow on me as I listen to the CD. That is her singing. It is different and very fitting in most songs, but I tired of it after listening to the songs over and over, and that shouldn't be happening. Her voice is deep and sometimes seems to be talking with exaggerated inflections. I will say however that she puts her all into her lyrics and I applaud her for that. It is an interesting collection of songs, and if you haven't experienced her music, this is a good place to start.

## Sugar Blue Threshold Beeble Music

If you had a chance to catch Sugar Blue at Garvin Gate or elsewhere, you know you're always in for an energetic show. He always works the harp top-notch and his singing too. His new CD, Threshold, contains the same but with one exception; this is not a Chicago blues album. He has branched out into different progressions like Jamaican, fusion jazz, etc, and offers a new arrangement of "Messin' With the Kid" that sounds refreshing for 2010. His band is very skilled and shrewd. The last track is an interview with Sugar about his career.

Debbie Davies Holdin' Court Little Dipper/Vizztone LDIP001

Read the liner notes. This reviewer did not--at least not before inserting the CD into the player and hearing a few tracks.

Debbie Davies' 12th CD, and her first on Vizztone's Little Dipper label, is all instrumental. There, you've been saved the trouble (see line one). Davies fans may be used to her nice bluesy voice from previous releases; although she is very well known for her considerable guitar skills--which is

what you get on this CD. Guitar--very good guitar.

At first, not realizing what this is, there seems to be something "missing." But by the third track, this reviewer finally had an "aha" (or make that a "duhhh") moment and flipped open the CD package to find out there's no vocals. The liner notes mention that this is the result of several years of requests from fans to do just such an album. And with her guitargreat influences (Albert Collins, Frddie King, et al), she felt the muse and decided the time had come.

There are six originals and some covers on the 11-song list--a few of the covers are songs by well-known bluesmen and/ or guitarists, such as the opener "Fishnet" (Robillard) and "I Wonder Why (Blues in D Natural)" (Hooker). Throughout, regardless of originality, Davies proves she is one of the best pure blues guitarists around. Not earth-shatteringly dazzling, but solid and true. Her Fender Strats produce crystal clear, stinging and clean sounds with little if any effects. All-in-all, it's mostly blues with a little bit of "West Coast Cool" and funk thrown in and a hint of Western Swing and Latin sounds.

It's difficult to pick out the best tunes on this CD. The title track bears mention because of its interesting mix of slightly Latin sound mixed with blues and a very sweet melody. "I Wonder Why" pulls Davies into the more sensual side of the blues, and she really works the emotional side with her guitar. And the final track is a powerful blues rocker that'll get you up and moving.

By the end of this recording, even if you really like her voice, you'll likely agree it's a welcome change. Debbie Davies can certainly "hold court" with anyone.

## Mac Arnold and Plate Full O' Blues Country Man Vizztone Records CD-PNO-001

I was exposed to Arnold in another CD review not too long ago. I liked that one, so I volunteered to review this one. He has his unique approach to the music that sets him apart from the city blues I am so used to hearing. His rural (South Carolina in Arnold's case) has a different feel to it, both in music and lyrics. Arnold's voice is not polished. It is as though a person off the street (or the farm) steps in front of the microphone to tell a story which just happens to have music to it,

and has a feel of sincerity and realism.

There are 13 songs on the CD, which is produced by "Steady Rollin" Bob Margolin. Margolin plays guitar on a few of the tracks, but quite honestly, the best ones feature Austin Brashier on guitar. Arnold's "Plate Full O' Blues" consists of Max Hightower on keys, harmonica, and rhythm guitar, Austin Brashier on guitar, Mike Whitt on drums, Danny Keylon on bass, and Margolin. Arnold himself sings and is known for his homemade guitar made from a gas can.

The CD is named "Country Man" for a reason. Songs include "Farmer" which speaks of values following in your father's footsteps and reaping what you sow. "This Ol' Tractor" which is about, the next time he is off this ol' tractor, he is going to ride by his baby's house, spend some time on her front porch, barefoot, drinking tea. He spends all of his time working the farm, driving the tractor, thinking about his baby. The title track celebrates living in the country with a dirt driveway, wearing a straw hat (and incidentally, this song has excellent harp work in it), drinking his tea from a Mason jar, etc. "Mule for a Chevrolet" is about trading his mule for a brand new Chevrolet so he can drive to Chicago.

"Screaming and Crying" is a slow acoustic slide guitar gem that you can't help but like. The song "Holdin' on to Lettin' Go" is a slow jazzy ballad that requires you to hit the repeat button on your CD player a couple of times. It is my favorite of many good songs.

Don't think that the "Country" of this CD is indicative of the type of music. Most of the songs are rollicking, quick moving songs with plenty of guitar work. There are fast ones and slow ones. At least one has a country beat to it, but folks, this is the blues.

I recommend this CD. Pop it in the player and lay back and catch the lyrics. Visit www.macarnold.com or visit his myspace page for more info or music samples.
