Letter From the Prez

It was hot, wet and very humid but thanks to all who came out to the first Germantown Schnitzelburg Blues Festival the second weekend of August. We had rain both days but it was early in the festival and didn't seem to dampen anyone's enthusiasm or the crowds. Both Zeppelin Cafe and Check's Cafe are still counting receipts from the festival but I think it will be considered a great success by all and should be back next year. In next month's issue I should also be able to report the amount raised for the Musician's Emergency Resource Foundation. This festival would not have been possible without the support of Tim and Nick Cain at Zeppelin Cafe, John Murrow at Check's Cafe, the Kentuckiana Blues Society, WFPK, Voluforms and Dana Roy of DMR Music. We'll have more on the festival in a later issue of *Blues News*.

Congratulations to Jimi V (Jimi Vallandingham) and Screamin' John (John Hawkins), winners of this year's KBS solo/duo contest. The contest was held at Lisa's Oak Street Lounge on Sunday, August 15. Lisa's was hot and the blues was hotter. Seven acts competed for a chance to represent the blues society in Memphis. We know Jimi and John will do a great job at the competition. A living blues legend will make his way to Louisville early this month. Willie "Big Eyes" Smith will be at Jim Porter's Tavern on Friday, September 3. Smith was born in Helena, AR in 1936 and made his way to Chicago by the early 1950's. After seeing Sonny Boy Williamson II he started playing the harmonica but later switched to the drums because drummers were more in demand. He started recording with Muddy Waters in the late 1950's and by 1961 was a member of Muddy's band. He left the band for a short time in the 1960's to work as a cab driver but returned to Muddy's band in the late 1960's and stayed with him until his death in 1983. Smith played on all of Muddy Water's Grammy winning albums and even appeared in the 1980 film *The Blues Brothers* as one of the musicians backing John Lee Hooker. He recorded his first solo album in 1995 and is still going strong at 74 years old. Accompanying Smith will be Chicago bass player Bob Stroger. If this weren't reason enough to see the show I'll give you one more good one. KBS members get in free by presenting their membership card at the door. The show starts at 8:00 pm.

The Point music festival returns to Carrollton, KY the second weekend of September but it is no longer an all-blues festival. "Blues at the Point" is now "Music & BBQ at the Point" and it will take place Friday and Saturday, September 10 and 11. Headliners for this year's show include Soul, Inc., the Greg Foresman Band, country music's Mickey Clark & the Blue Norther and Lamont Gillispie & 100 Proof. This year's Big Rock Jazz Festival will again feature a blues band as the closing act. The festival takes place on Sunday, October 3 in Cherokee Park from 2:00 pm to 7:00 pm. Bands this year include Steve Crew's Black Cat Band, the Mike Tracy Quintet and the Walnut Street Blues Band. There will also be several vintage Jaguar automobiles displayed at the festival. June 11-13, 2010

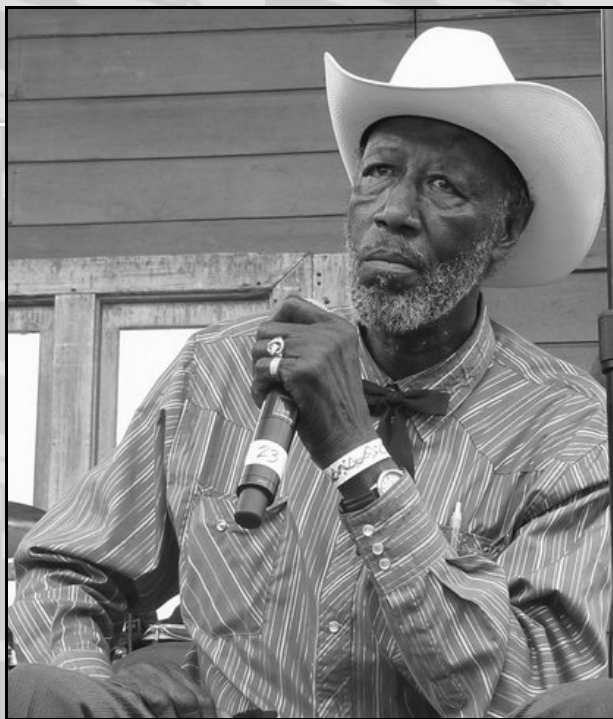
The 2010 Chicago Blues Festival opened with an invasion of Blackhawks fans celebrating their Stanley Cup victory and closed with the retirement of Barry Dolins, the major coordinator of the festival for each of its 27 years.



Buddy Guy was the gracious host at his blues club, Legends, which had just reopened two weeks earlier at 700 S. Wabash. That evening WXRT broadcasted a live show with Otis Taylor and Jimmy Johnson.



Grady Champion, the winner of the 2010 IBC band competition, was a crowd pleaser as he harped and sang his way through his set on the Juke Joint Stage.



The Taildragger left no tracks on the Front Porch Stage with his Howlin' Wolf tinged voice backed by the Jimmy Dawkins Band.

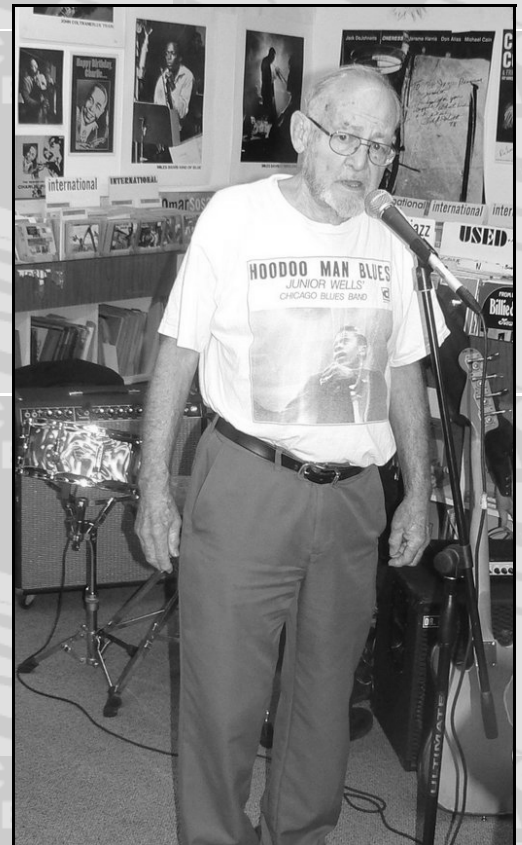


The reunion of James Cotton with Matt 'Guitar' Murphy was one of the highlights of the festival, seeing them together again after 30 years.

Carl Weathersby and Larry McCray had a duel of their Gibsons on the Crossroads Stage



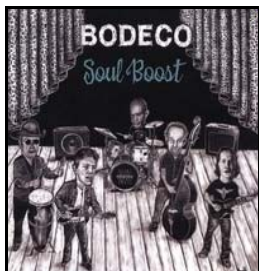
The Homemade Jamz Blues Band is the Perry family from Mississippi who give credence that the young generation of blues is alive and well.

New Music Reviews!



Bodeco
Soul Boost (EP)

I agreed to review this CD while under the influence. Of the CD. I didn't realize at the time that I would be in some pretty heavy company when I actually put fingers to keyboard. The LA Village View called Bodeco a "mix of twang and holler", Rick Reger of The Chicago Sun Times says, "Jimmy Brown chugs like a crack-fueled locomotive", and Karen Schoemer of the New York Times said that "the lead singer had a yelp that could have scared off a mugger". And on and on. There are dozens of reviews out there dating back to the early 90's and every one of them falters a bit trying to categorize or analyze what these guys are putting down. I don't have the pedigree or the imagination to match these critiques, but as the saying goes, I know what I like. This stuff is intoxicating...like Everclear and Hawaiian Punch. Think Dick Dale, but way dirtier. Soul Boost consists of five tracks, three of which are instrumental, and I honestly can not name a favorite. Trying to describe the Bodeco sound, I told a friend that it feels like an avalanche of big rocks hitting you in the head except it doesn't hurt. They say the name comes from Bo Diddley and Zydeco, but there's a lot more to it too. It's reckless and rollicking and funky and pure...the sound is consistent from the first album in 1992 to this EP. That's not to say that it all sounds alike, just that it is very distinctive. I always wondered why musicians put out EP's and now I know. After listening to the five cuts on this CD, I went back and bought their whole catalog. I guess it's one of those things...if you love it, you'll get it. And if you don't, there's no explaining it. Soul Boost is available at Ear X-tacy and online at CD Baby, and Bodeco will be playing live at Zanzabar on South Preston on September 11th.

Elvin Bishop
Red Dog Speaks
Delta Groove Music DGPCD138

The latest release by this founding member of the Michael Bloomfield Blues Band is similar to his last release. Bishop is an accomplished musician, and has indeed played an important role in the Chicago Blues Scene of yesterday. His current effort relies on his reputation and his humor however. Bishop has recorded 11 songs on this CD. "Red Dog" is Bishop's guitar that he has used for many years. The title track tells of his history with "Red Dog" in spoken lyrics.

Guests on the CD include John Nemeth, Roy Gaines, Tommy Castro, Ronnie Baker Brooks, Buckwheat Zydeco, Kid Anderson and others. Most of these appear by virtue of being on the Blues Cruise, as the one track ("Blues Cruise") with all of these stars was recorded on said Cruise.

Bishop fans will like his slide guitar playing in the unmistakable sound he creates. His song "Clean Living" is a humorous song that showcases his slide playing. He is frank about his age (68) and jokes about not being in the grave yet.

Bishop fans will appreciate this CD, but it won't get much play at my house.

Karen Carroll
Talk To The Hand
Delmark Records DE680

Francine Reed meets Muddy Waters. That's how Karen Carroll sounds at times on this 13-track release from Delmark. At other times, she sounds a bit more "smooth" but always soulful and sassy. Carroll also wrote seven of the 13 tunes.

She's joined by guitarist Walter Scott and Roosevelt Purifoy on keyboards, and backed by the rhythm section of bassist Willie Samuels, Jr., and drummer Jon Hiller. It's a solid effort overall with a few standouts in a set list that ranges from big-band-esque Chicago-style blues, to gospel to blues rock to jazz and even a country-sounding tune which closes it all out (which seems a little odd, even for a more "eclectic" blues CD).

Some of the highlights are the heavy Chicago style opener "Ain't It Nice," the up-tempo gospel stylings of "Tired of Being Mistreated," (with some nice vocal backup from Roberta Thomas and Purifoy's keys), the cover of Nina Simone's "Do I Move You?" and the traditional "Sweet Home Chicago" (on which the guitar actually kinda sounds like it's being played by Chuck Berry; although the credits list Johnny B. Moore).

Overall, a solid effort.
