

## **Letter From the Prez**

The 40th Annual Cherokee Triangle Art Fair kicks off the spring and summer concert series in Willow Park near the intersection of Cherokee Pkwy, Cherokee Rd and Willow Ave on Sunday, May 1. Music that day will be provided by the jump blues band King Sonic from 1:00 until 3:00 pm and then the Jaywalkers will play their mix of blues, soul and r&b from 3:30 to 5:30 pm. More information on the art fair is located on-line at http://cherokeetriangle.org/.

Blues will not be in short supply during Derby week in the bluegrass state. On Sunday, May 1 the Vernon Club will host a "FunRaiser" for Kentucky Homefront that will also be a tribute to Tim Krekel. Four hours of music starts at 4:00 pm with Kessler's Friends followed by the KingBees, TKO and the Beat Daddys. The suggested donation is \$10. The Kentucky Theatre in Lexington will host Los Angeles based blues vocalist Janiva Magness on Monday, May 2 as part of the WoodSong Old-Time Radio Hour. Stevie Ray's will feature Chicago blues gui-

tarist Ronnie Baker Brooks on Wednesday, May 4 followed by a Harmonica Showdown hosted by Lamont Gillispie and his band on Thursday, May 5. Natasha's Bistro in Lexington will have a rare solo appearance by Northern Blues Music recording artist Watermelon Slim on Friday, May 6. On Derby night, Saturday, May 7, Jim Porter's will be jumping with the blues, swing and jazz music of the Kansas City band Grand Marquis. Don't forget to make a visit to the Chow Wagon on Waterfront Park during the week. Lamont and 100 Proof will be there on Sunday, May 1 at 5:30 pm and Robbie Bartlett on Wednesday, May 4 at 4:00 pm. And if the weather is good be sure to look for the 10th Street Blues Band busking in front of the Vault Liquors on Bardstown Rd Derby weekend. The liquor store is next to the Mid City Mall and across from Carmichael's Books. Check the full calendar of events Derby week on page 10.

The Pitt Academy BBQ on Preston Hwy is the first blues festival of the season on Saturday, May 21. The barbecue festival will mark it's 27th year and in 2008 David Harrod of Frankfort, who has a son attending classes at Pitt, convinced the school to add a blues music tent on the grounds. This year's festival will bring back one of Louisville's favorite adopted sons. George Heard aka Harmonica Red of Pitkin, LA, returns to Pitt with his band the New Heard. Red had to relocate to Frankfort after Hurricane Katrina in 2005 and soon became a favorite at the Tuesday night blues jam at Longshot Tavern on Frankfort Ave. Harmonica Red returned to Louisiana in 2009 but he and his band will be the closing act this year at Pitt. Red and his band will play from 9:00 to 11:00 pm, da Mudcats from 6:30 to 8:30 pm and David Harrod's band Here for the Party start the day from 4:00 to 6:00 pm. Last year Greg Thomerson, better known as G. Busy, organized the first annual Blues Between the Bridges Festival at Riptide on the River in Lexington. The festival returns this year on Sunday, May 29. Ten bands on two stages will play during the day starting at 2:00 pm. This year a festival kick-off will take place on Saturday night, May 28 at The Crossroads on Southland. The music will start that day at Lexington's newest blues bar at 5:30 pm. In addition to Louisville's Germantown Schnitzelburg Blues Festival the first weekend in June, the Lake Cumberland Blues, Boats and BBQ Festival will take place on Saturday, June 4 at the State Dock in Jamestown, KY. This is the third year for the festival and it will feature a large Louisville contingent including the KingBees, da Mudcats, King Sonic, the Cole Stevens Band, Velveeta Jones and Long Tall Deb and the Drifter Kings from Columbus, OH. Other blues shows of note in the next six weeks include Tin Can Buddha at Natasha's Bistro in Lexington on May 27 and 28, Buddy Guy at the Brown Theater on Wednesday, June 1 and Tab Benoit at Stevie Ray's on Monday, June 13.

Jimmy G and the Sidewinders started hosting a new blues jam at Gilbert's Bar & Grill in south Louisville on Wednesday, April 20. The jam will take place every Wednesday night starting at 9:00 pm. Gilbert's is located at 4950 Terry Road near the intersection of Terry Road and Cane Run Road.

# New Music Reviews!





### Sixteen Bars Delta Flyers Soulbilly Music Group

The Delta Flyers' "record label" says a lot about their latest release of 10 original tunes. In fact, it nearly sums it up as far as genre and sound is concerned. Just add the word "blues" to the mix and you've got it.

Elements of country, bluegrass, soul and blues are presented by Steve DuPree and Travis Stephenson as the group's leaders, with DuPree handling the lead vocals, blues harp and percussion while Stephenson plays electric, acoustic, resophonic (and slide) guitar, porchboard and

backs up Steve on vocals. They're joined by Jack Saunders on upright bass, reso guitar, percussion and harmonies; drummer Rick Richards, Rich DelGrosso on blues mandolin; Sister Tommie Lee Bradley on harmony vocals and "background noises" courtesy of (get this) The Fabulous Inebriators!

All the tunes are very good--one might even use the word "fun" in describing the effect and tone. They do a very good job with all 10 songs. The best, however, are the first two. The opener, "61 Highway Blues," is fairly traditional (even in length at just under three and a half minutes), Chicago-style, with a screaming slide guitar reminiscent of Elmore James and Hound Dog Taylor playing their signature 1, 4, 5-chord progressions and slide riffs Following that one is the title track, which greases the juke floor with slide guitar, blues harp and might be labeled country blues just to call it something.

However you label it, this music is good stuff.

### Seriously Raw: Live at Sunbanks Cee Cee James Blue Skunk Music 4532

CeeCee James. Not a household name--except maybe in the Pacific Northwest, where this blueswoman has been living for some time after relocating from Los Angeles. After listening, though, it'll be easy to remember her. Very easy.

The CD is aptly titled. This is raw, emotional, and gritty. Ms James' vocals often conjure up audible comparisons to Janis.

The Sunbanks Rhythm & Blues Festival (also not exactly a national household name) takes place in the spring and fall in Eastern Washington State. This CD was recorded at this event (their first time at the fest), and it's very well produced, with Ms James being allowed out front where she belongs. And she can do blues, folks. This is a totally blues CD (well, there are a couple of exceptions). You can also get a very good sense of her comfort onstage and good rapport with her band and the audience.

Joined by Rob Andrews on rhythm and slide guitar, Chris Leighton on drums, Dan Mohler on bass and Jason Childs playing lead guitar, 14 songs (well, actually 13--more on that later) feature three originals and the rest are covers of Willie Dixon, Robert Johnson, Hound Dog Taylor and Luther Allison tunes, among others. Whatever song is performed here, Ms James basically takes each and owns it. It helps, of course, that her band is one of the tightest around. She's got a great sense of rhythm and how to fit her stage banter into the songs without missing a beat--and a real talent for settling into the groove.

Since this is a CD review and not a biography or feature, it can only be offered as speculation (technically) that track four, arguably the best tune on the list, is her autobiography. Just listen to the lyrics. It's too vivid, too real to not be. (Being somewhat familiar with her life and career also helped this reviewer draw this conclusion.). "I Got a Right to Sing the Blues" shows she's come by the blues honestly. It's a simply-played melody framed by traditional blues progressions with some great slide solos from Andrews. This is one tune where you must also really listen to the lyrics.

A few tunes seem like they might not "fit." Kristofferson's "Me and Bobby McGee" made famous by Janis and the author himself, is one example. However, in typical fashion, Ms James takes the song and owns it. "Mercedes Benz," almost makes you think it IS Janis singing. While not traditional blues, somehow it works here. Tina Turner's "Nutbush City Limits" is also well done. While these songs might not "belong," one can cut the band some slack for sheer performance here.

Track 14, listed as untitled, shows her sense of humor. The crowd apparently craves Janis songs, and Ms James simply quips that she doesn't do a lot of Janis, people shouldn't copy, all that stuff. She says this after over an hour of sounding a LOT like the late iconic rocker. Here, she can't decide what to sing, and changes her mind at least four or five times, continuing to laugh and joke with the crowd. In fact, the last track is nothing but this. They never do start a song (at least it never made it on the CD if they did an encore). An interesting note here: During this six or seven-minute time frame, Ms James thanks (and it's also in the liner notes) Leanne (Trevalyan) and Billy (Stoops), who lived in Louisville for a while during the 1990s fronting a band called Junkyard Jane before returning back to Washington State (apparently Leanne, at least is from there).

Final verdict: This CD is highly recommended. If you want to take a chance on an "unknown"--this is a sure winner.

### Doin' Well Jimmy Davis

Jimmy Davis is a favorite of mine on the festival circuit. I have seen him at Madison, Carrolton, and the Water Tower festivals. He has played electric at a couple of them, and solo acoustic at a particularly memorable set at the acoustic stage at Carrolton. Not only is he a talented guitarist, but he teaches music also, and plays around his hometown of Madison on a regular basis. Jimmy went to Nashville to record this latest CD of his, at the Sony studios.

Although Jimmy plays a lot around the Madison area, I have only heard him at the above mentioned festivals. He is one of the best guitarists I have seen and his acoustic set at Carrolton, mentioned above, was

inspiring to me.

Getting around to the CD, the first song on the CD startled me. It is straight up country music- and quite good. Followed by another country song. And another. And another. I have no doubt that Jimmy can play guitar for any genre he likes. What is startling is that his singing takes on a country twang that I have never heard. Song number 8 is titled "Telephone Blues", but alas, is still a country tune (a lot of country tunes have bluesy themes anyway, so there is nothing unusual about this).

One thing that stands out on the CD is Davis' use of the slide and Dobro guitar. He is very good at this guitar style and he uses it on several songs.

I know that most blues lovers also like other genres of music and I know a few that like country music. This CD is for those people. For the blues lovers, however, this is a no show. What it does do is give you an appreciation for Davis talent in that he has mastered more than one genre. A lot of musicians can play more than one genre, but he is very good at it and when hearing him play blues I assumed that he only played blues because of his proficiency at it. He is much deeper than I thought.

### Jus' Desserts Tas Cru Crustee Tees

I was going to start out this review with some comments about Cru's latest CD, its performers etc. When doing a little research I found that he is not just a blues performer but a dedicated blues teacher and I thought it important enough to mention first. From upstate New York, he is not only an accomplished musician and songwriter, but is very active in Blues in the Schools. Dr, Richard Bates, PhD aka Tas "the professor" Cru has put together a comprehensive program for schools in his locale that is truly impressive. His mission statement starts out: "Blues is a

uniquely American music that along with gospel and jazz is one of America's most precious gifts to the world....." He has developed programs for different grade levels, different classes (for example, literacy and language, social studies etc). I would love to attend one of his classes myself. Visit his website and download his Blues Education brochure at http://www.tascru.com/#content\_\_state=blues\_education\_content. One more thing-Cru hosts the pre-IBC jams in Memphis and has for the last 6 years.

OK. "How about the CD?" you say. This is the second CD I have reviewed by Cru. The first, "Grizzle and Bone" from 2009 was one that I recommended. This one includes 11 songs, all of which pretty much prove his credentials to teach the blues. He inter-mixes humor with his music and the result is an enjoyable combination.

From the first song, "Just Let it Happen", you are drawn to the lyrics. This song tells of his doctor letting him know that he is too stressed and needs to jut let it (life) happen. "Time and Time" is a slow acoustic tune that differs from the other songs on the CD and is a more serious blues song, and the longest on the CD at 6:38.

My favorite song on the CD is "GPS Mama" which talks about his woman who loves telling him where to go. "Eau de 'Nother Man" is a slow bluesy tune about finding out about another man's visit to his woman. "Kinda Mess" is a one of those songs that makes you tap your feet/fingers etc.- a quick moving, rocking, harmonica filled, shuffle, fun song. The title song "Jus Desserts" is the easiest song to figure out what it is about from its title. Blues fans will need no explanation of this one.

This CD includes some slow, fast, electric, acoustic, swing, blues etc. It has a little bit for everybody.

"When the Swallows Come Back to Capistrano" OR "The House Band Returns to Filson"

Each year, in the near dead of winter, the Tenth Street Blues Band makes its annual pilgrimage back to that towering tank of Kentucky History – the Filson Club. This year marked the 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of this get together where the band members' combined and separate talents could shine. The band members are: Billy Bird, providing vocals and harp, James Watkins on bass guitar, Pen Bogert on an old Gibson Guitar that had some really good sounds left in it, and also playing an Epiphone lap steel on some tunes (I think he said it was made in the 1950's), and Sonny Sitgraves on drums and added funny expressions whenever the mood struck him. Joe Jr. usually plays second guitar with this band but he was sick this night and unable to sit in.

The band played two sets, providing just over two hours of listening pleasure for the audience which seemed to be much larger than in recent years. The band treated us to a cornucopia of old and older blues songs that not many were familiar with, would be my guess. This event needs to be better advertised so more people can get out and witness this blues testimonial.
